*2. Data Analysis (restate or summarize the data analysis from the PRP):

Although there was a significant increase initially in Africana Studies enrollment in the 2007 academic year, due to the AS faculty resignation, we lost our full time Africana Studies instructor which affected our program and its development. However, our recent acquisition of part-time faculty Paula Johnson Nash has resulted in higher enrollment in Africana courses as well as the re-establishment of the Black Student Alliance Youth Organization, which was absent from the College for nearly 15 years. The current professors in Africana Studies, Dr. Martin Japtok, Dr. Phillip DeBarros, and part-time professor Paula Johnson-Nash enable their students to gain new perspectives, new insights, and develop improved interactions with other people due to the insights and experiences of the instructors. For a quality education, it is crucial that we have the best and the brightest instructors and the students deserve to have the highest caliber and the commitment of a full-time faculty position in Africana Studies and to participate in a continually growing Africana Studies curriculum.

Through their charisma, experiences and leadership Paula Johnson Nash, Dr. Phillip DeBarros and Dr. Martin Japtok are bringing enthusiasm, knowledge and cultural understanding while broadening the base of students through their inclusion of all students within the Palomar community, as well as stabilizing African Studies while looking to its future growth. However, the Africana Studies certificate program should be a top priority of the college and to ensure its success a full time faculty is necessary. Further, the commitment to hire a full-time Africana Studies instructor will revive the program and further demonstrate Palomar College's dedication to the principles of diversity and inclusiveness.
