PART 2: PROGRAM REFLECTION

1. Program Analysis:

Our Efficiency rate has gone up 10% from Fall 2015 to 2016. This number has climbed steadily since the fall of 2014. We are excited about this number but at 362 we are below the 525 that is the official target. Our success rate has increased substantially (24%) and is at 82.4%, nearly 18% higher than the school target. And our retention rate at 93.4 is excellent and 2.4% higher than the year prior. AAs and Certificates stand at 16 for the time frame noted. We feel this data reflects the upward swing that is our goal in our discipline and as the addition of two online courses are not reflected here, we are confident that our efficiency rate will strongly improve with the next data set.

3. Program Update:

We are proud of a number of achievements in our department. Our students have won numerous Photojournalism awards including Best Sports Photo, Best News video, Best non-news video, Best Magazine Photo Story and more. One of our Photojournalism and Portfolio students, Cam Buker, created a book and also won a summer internship with a paper in New York. Our students have won 1st 2nd, 3rd place money awards in the International Competition at the San Diego County Fair, as well as Best of Class in Student Showcase in the San Diego County Fair. Our students participated in our annual Exhibition, Enlightened Lens, which was shown in the communities of Escondido, San Marcos and Vista. No other college extends their photography program into the community with an exhibition in this way and it is good prep for those who want to advance their careers. One of our students, Morgan DeLuna, was accepted into an important San Diego show and was consequently asked to do a one-person show of her work in a gallery in San Diego. Several of our former students have begun their own business in the photographic field.

Continue to do Community Outreach through visits to High schools, through service learning, and through our exhibition that travels in the community. We have created a stronger web presence and are now better positioned in social media as well. We now offer two sections of online History of Photography and one section of Digital Camera online. We are encouraging our instructors to take online training in Canvas and POET. In addition, the photography department now offers 3 noncredit classes and are building more. We are also developing a summer program of non for credit classes.

Yes-we were to have hired an approved full-time lab tech and it has not happened. This creates added burdens on our faculty and staff.

Our Program SLO assessment proved that our students are able to produce exhibition-quality work through participating in three Palomar juried exhibitions this last academic year plus several were included in juried shows in the wider art world.
