# AB705 Impact

- AB705 has radically changed how we place, enroll, and support students in English, math, and English as a Second Language (ESL) courses.
- It impacts student services (outreach, enrollment and placement, counseling and guidance), and instruction (curriculum and instructional support).
- At its core it seeks to address longstanding equity gaps in transfer level math and English completion.

Examine the impact of AB705 on student placement, enrollment, and outcomes.

### Math Transfer Level – Placement

#### Overall

- All subpopulations have increased placements.
- Overall increase by over 50% points, from 8% to 63% placed in transfer-level.

#### Gender

• Males are less likely to be placed in transfer-level math.

#### Race & Ethnicity

• While volume has increased across all categories, there is continued variances and differences over time.

#### **LGBT**

- Fall 2019 cohort is the first with meaningful data.
- LGBT are more likely to be placed in transfer-level math.

### Math Transfer Level – Placement

#### **Foster Youth**

• Foster Youth are less likely to be placed in transfer-level math.

#### **DSPS Student**

• DSPS are less likely to be placed in transfer-level math.

#### **Economic Disadvantage**

• Economically disadvantaged students are slightly more likely to be placed in transfer-level math.

#### Veteran

• Veterans are less likely to be placed in transfer-level math.







# Math Transfer-Level Course Success by Ethnicity












# Math Transfer-Level Course Success by Perkins Economically Disadvantaged





## Math-Success Rates

### Overall

- Success rates in transfer-level math decreased, while enrollments and success volume increased.
- Overall decrease of 4.5% points from 54.9% to 50.4%.

### Gender

- Success rate gap remained consistent.
- Females outpaced males.

## Race & Ethnicity

- Success Rate decreased more for Black and Hispanic students compared to students in other categories.
- White, non-Hispanic student success rates did not change.

### **LGBT**

• Fall 2019 cohort is the first with meaningful data.

## Math-Success Rates

### **Foster Youth**

• Observed increased success rates for foster youth over time.

### **DSPS Students**

• Success rates have decreased over time with slightly higher success for DSPS students.

## **Economic Disadvantage**

• Success rates have decreased over time, and are currently lower than non-economically disadvantaged students.

#### Veteran

- Success rates decreased over time, but the differences remained stable.
- Number of veterans decreased.

- Number of fall first-time students completing transfer-level math within one year.
- Percent of fall first-time students completing transfer-level math within one year.







## English Transfer-Level Course Success by Ethnicity



# English Transfer-Level Course Success by LGBT Status




# English Transfer-Level Course Success by Foster Youth Status




# English Transfer-Level Course Success by Perkins Economically Disadvantaged



## Discussion

## Summary – Equity Results

Overall, all subpopulations saw increases in placements and throughput.

The overall success rates for transfer-level math decreased, though the number of successes increased.

Asians, Black or African Americans, and DSPS students saw gains in English placements relative to others.

DSPS saw gains in English throughput and math success, but fell further behind in terms of math placement and throughput.

## Summary – Equity Results

Relative to others, foster youth were disadvantaged in transfer-level math placement, but saw gains in math success and throughput.

Males were disadvantaged across most outcomes.

Black or African American students were disadvantaged for success and throughput for both English and math.

Hispanics were disadvantaged in terms of success rates in English and math, and for throughput in math.
