AB705 Impact

- AB705 has radically changed how we place, enroll, and support students in English, math, and English as a Second Language (ESL) courses.
 - It impacts student services (outreach, enrollment and placement, counseling and guidance), and instruction (curriculum and instructional support).
 - At its core it seeks to address longstanding equity gaps in transfer level math and English completion.

Research Questions - Placement

- Do applicants and enrollees receive a placement recommendation?
- What is the distribution of placement recommendations?
- Are the placement recommendations clear to students?
- Are they accurate?
- Are there equity gaps?



Research Questions - Enrollment

- Have enrollments in English and math changed over time?
- Are students following their placement recommendations?
- Do students feel appropriately placed?
- Do faculty perceive students to be appropriately placed?



Research Questions - Outcomes

- Course
 - What are the course success rates in transfer level math and English courses?
 - Have they changed overtime?
 - Are there equity gaps? If so, have they decreased with AB705 implementation?
- Throughput *
 - What is our throughput? Has it changed over time?
 - Are there equity gaps? If so, have they decreased with AB705 implementation?

*Throughput = volume and percent of first-time students who complete transfer-level math and English in one year.

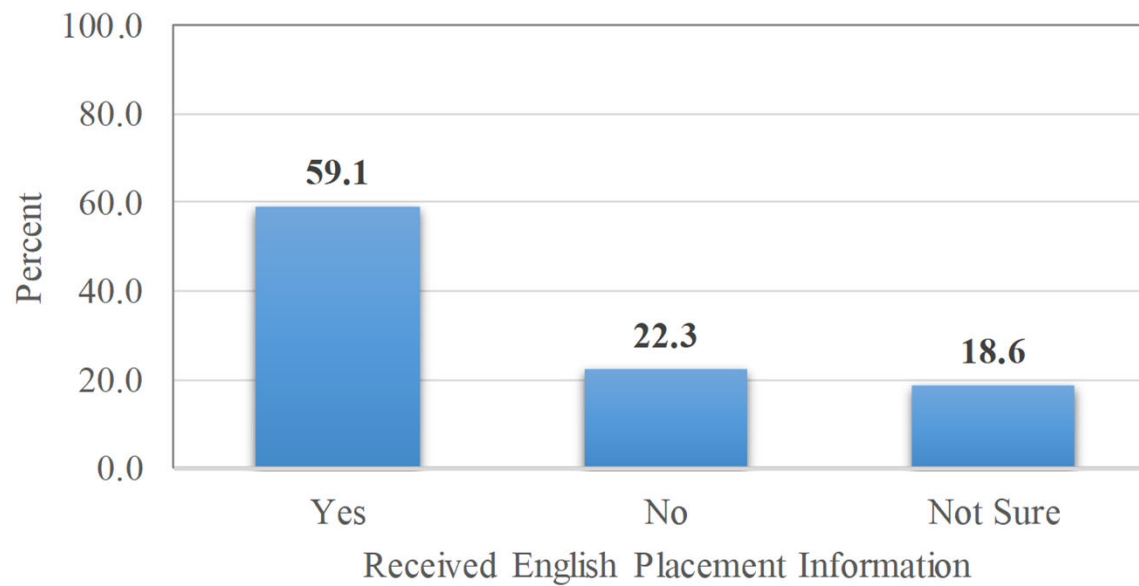

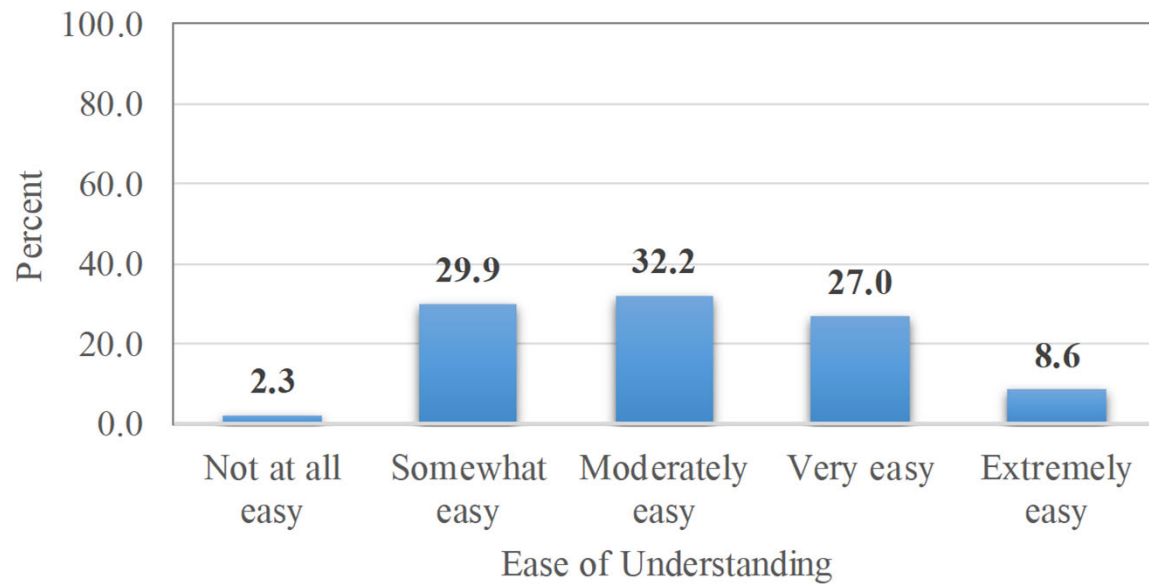

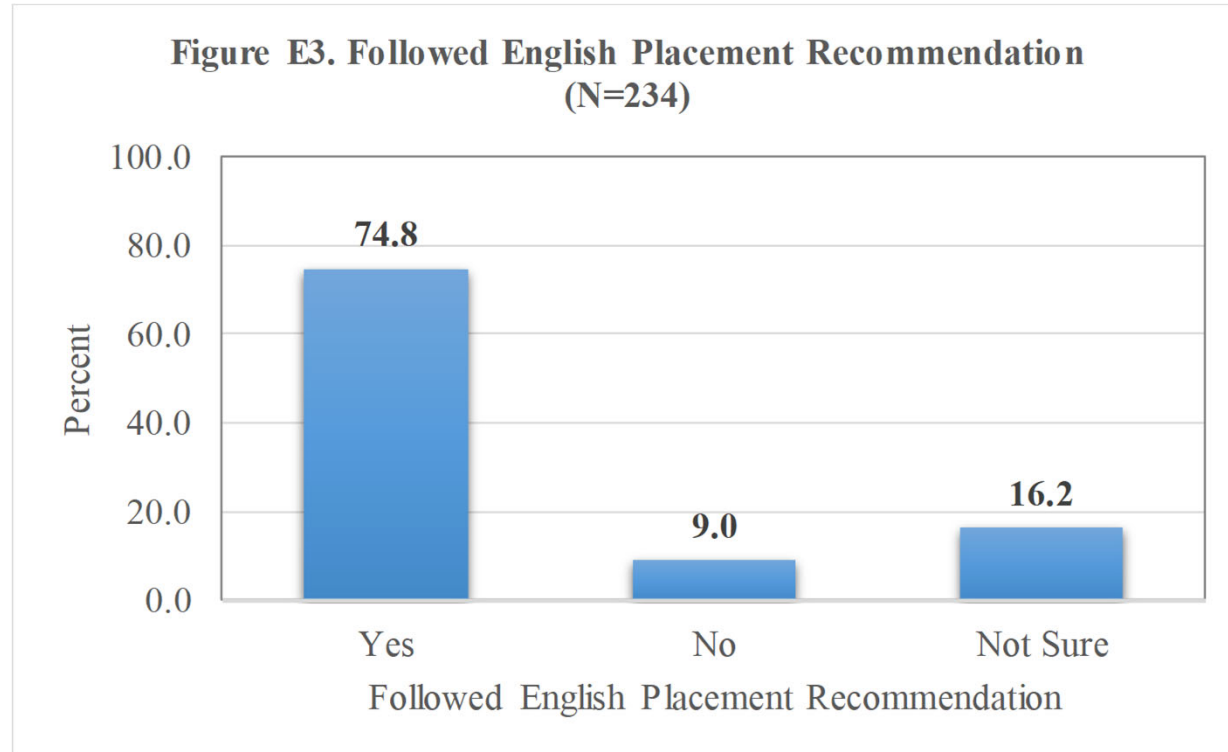

Student Suggestions for Improving the Placement Process

"If it's not too much of a hassle, maybe communicate with me through email please :]"

"I asked my counselor what she recommended and she was helpful at first but when I tried adding the class it said I needed a support class with it. So I contacted my counselor and she was like yes you need to add it but then I later figured out I could switch the time and teacher and it didn't make me add a support class. I ended up without a support class but she made it unclear to me whether I needed it at first. "

"Have the high school counselors tell us about it so we know a little more."

"Emailing it to you and explaining why"

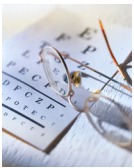

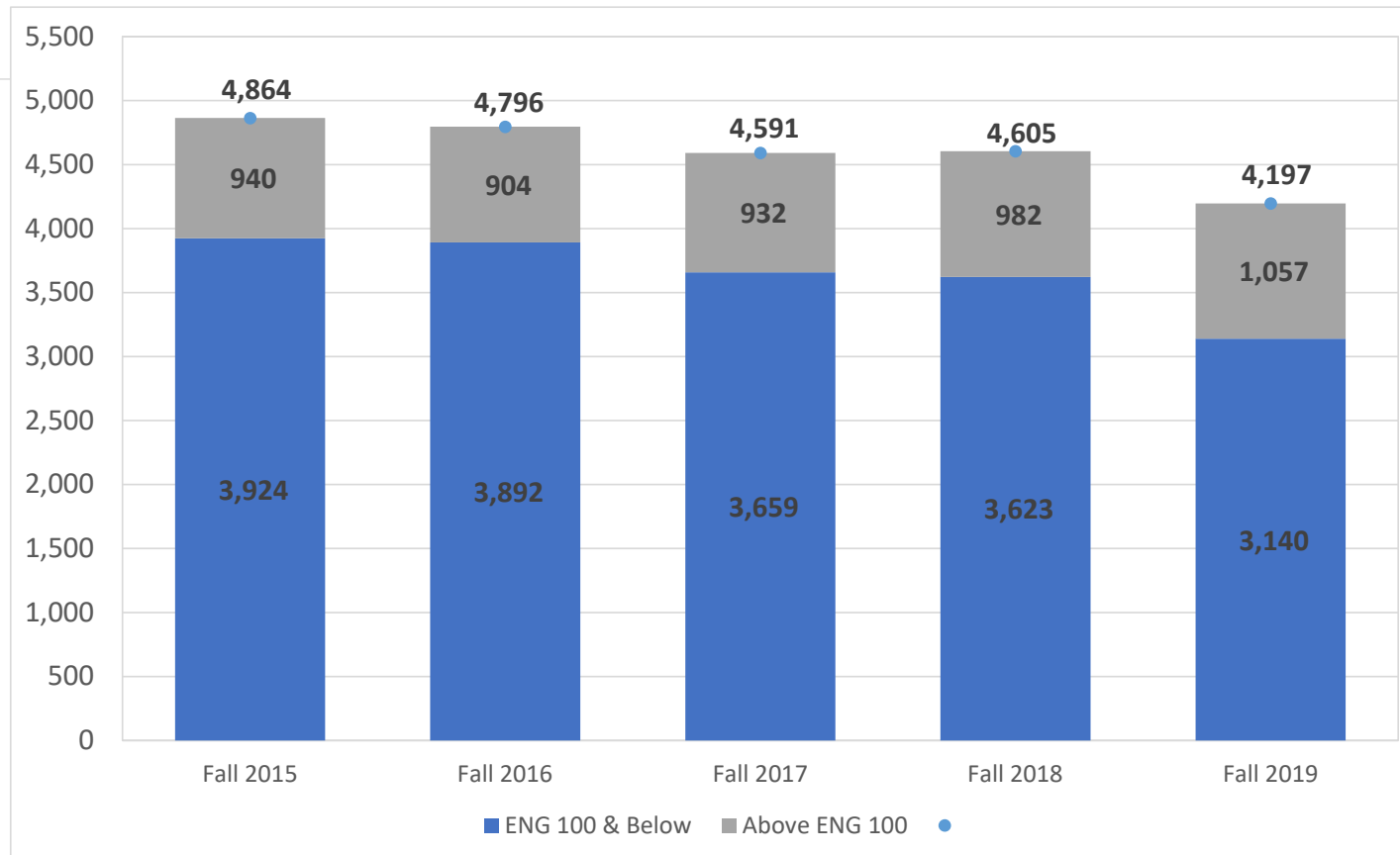

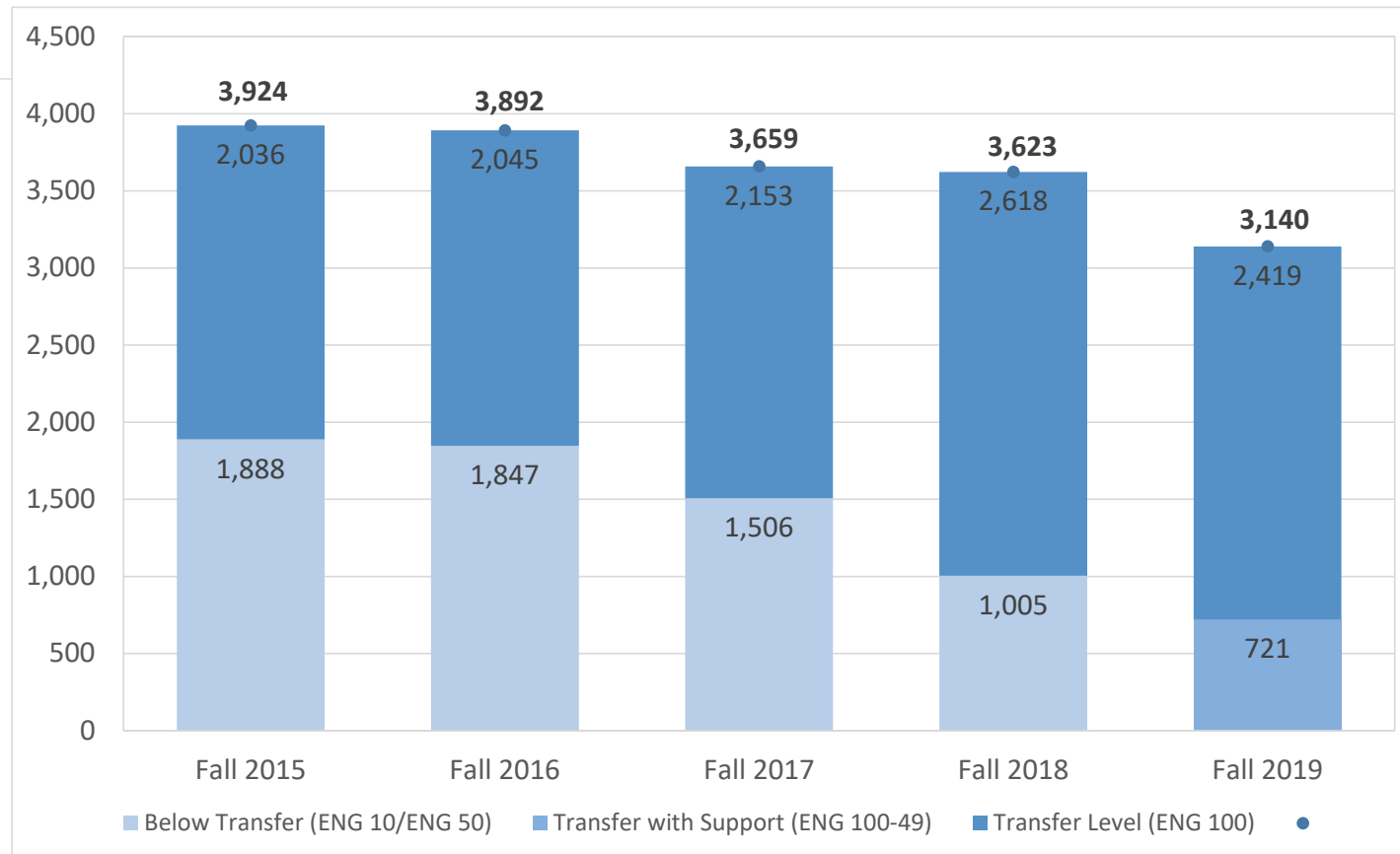

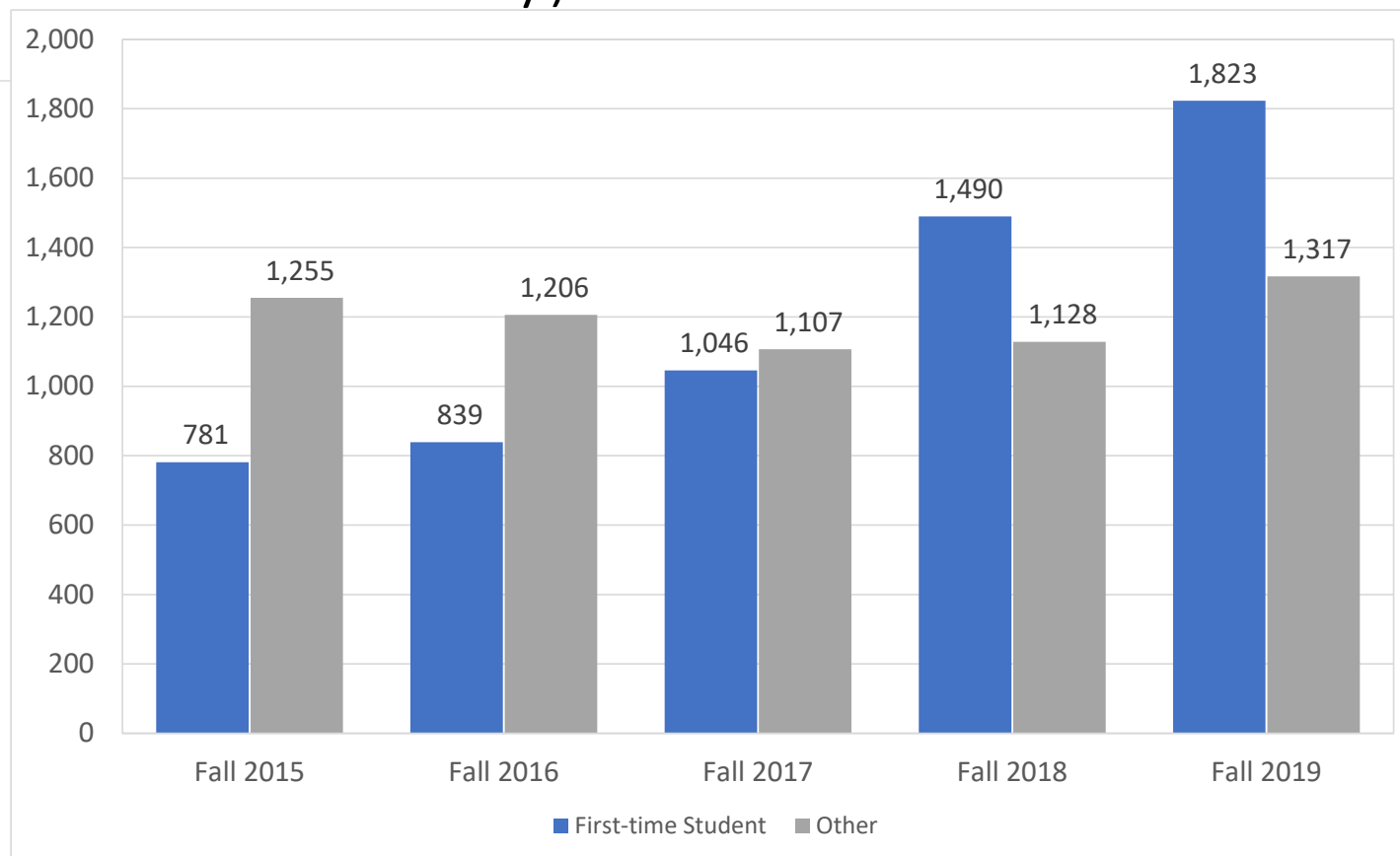

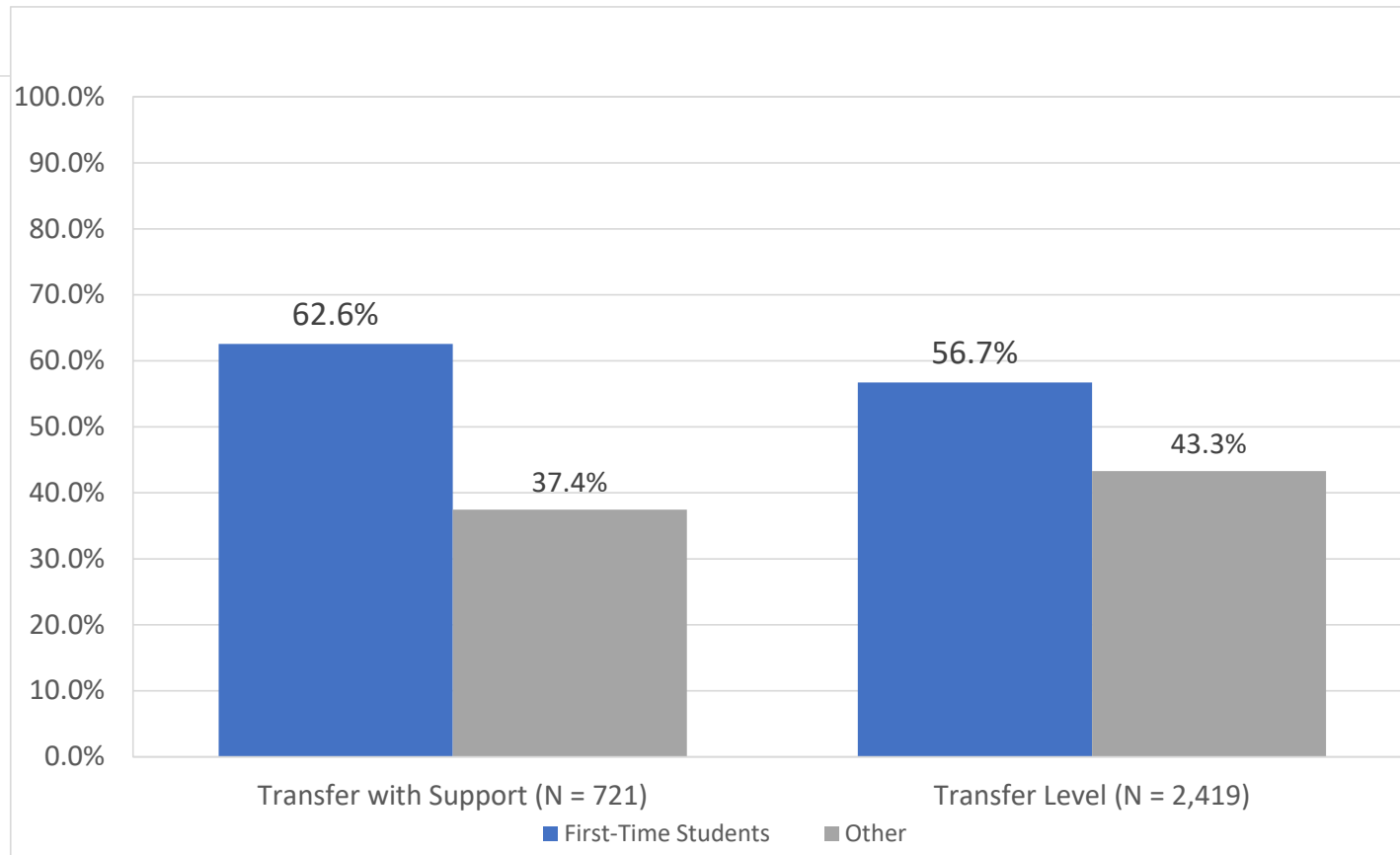
English Composition Enrollments By Transfer Level



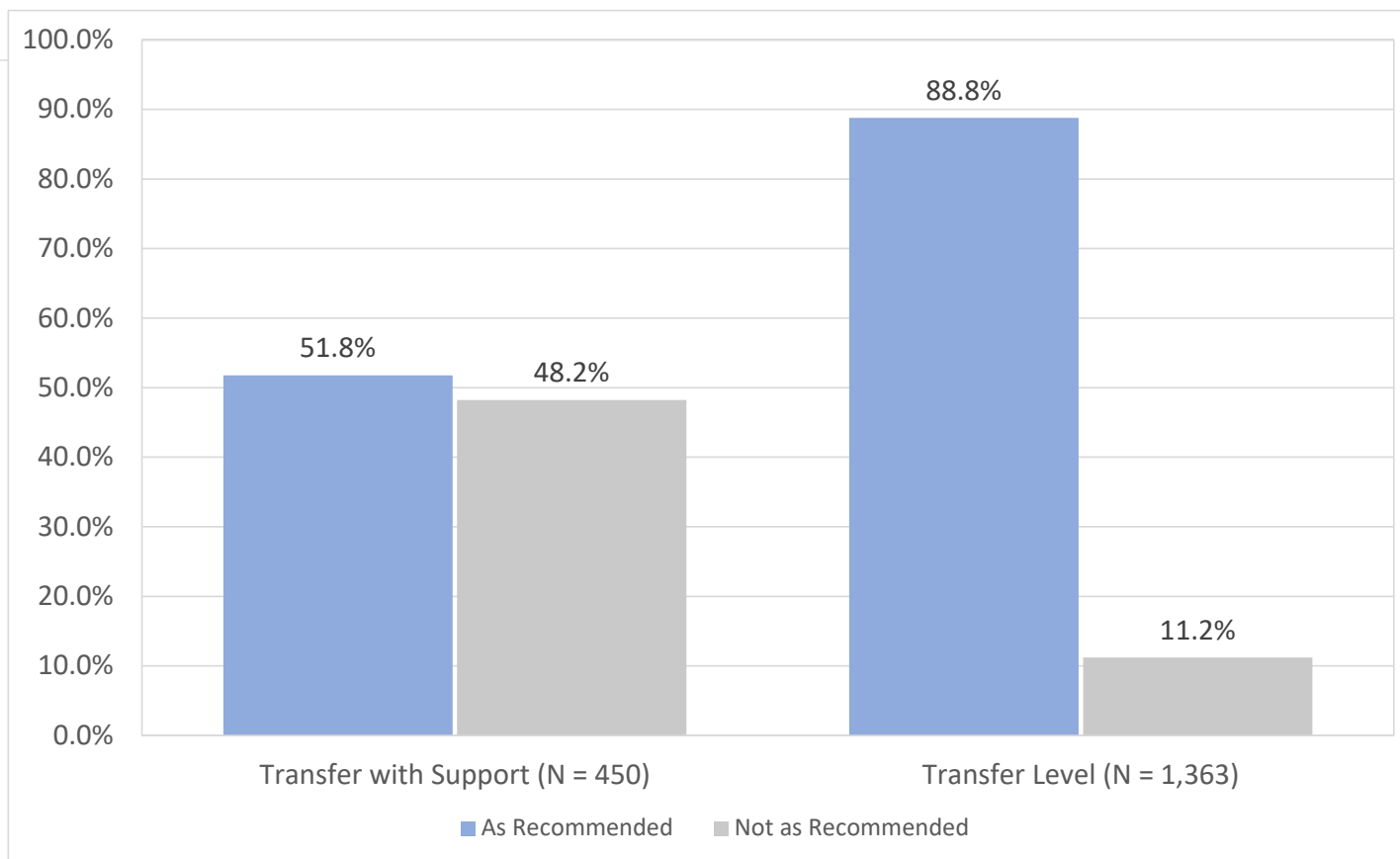
English Composition Enrollments by Enrollment Status (Transfer Course Only)

Fall 2019 Alignment of First-Time Student Enrollment with English Placement Recommendation

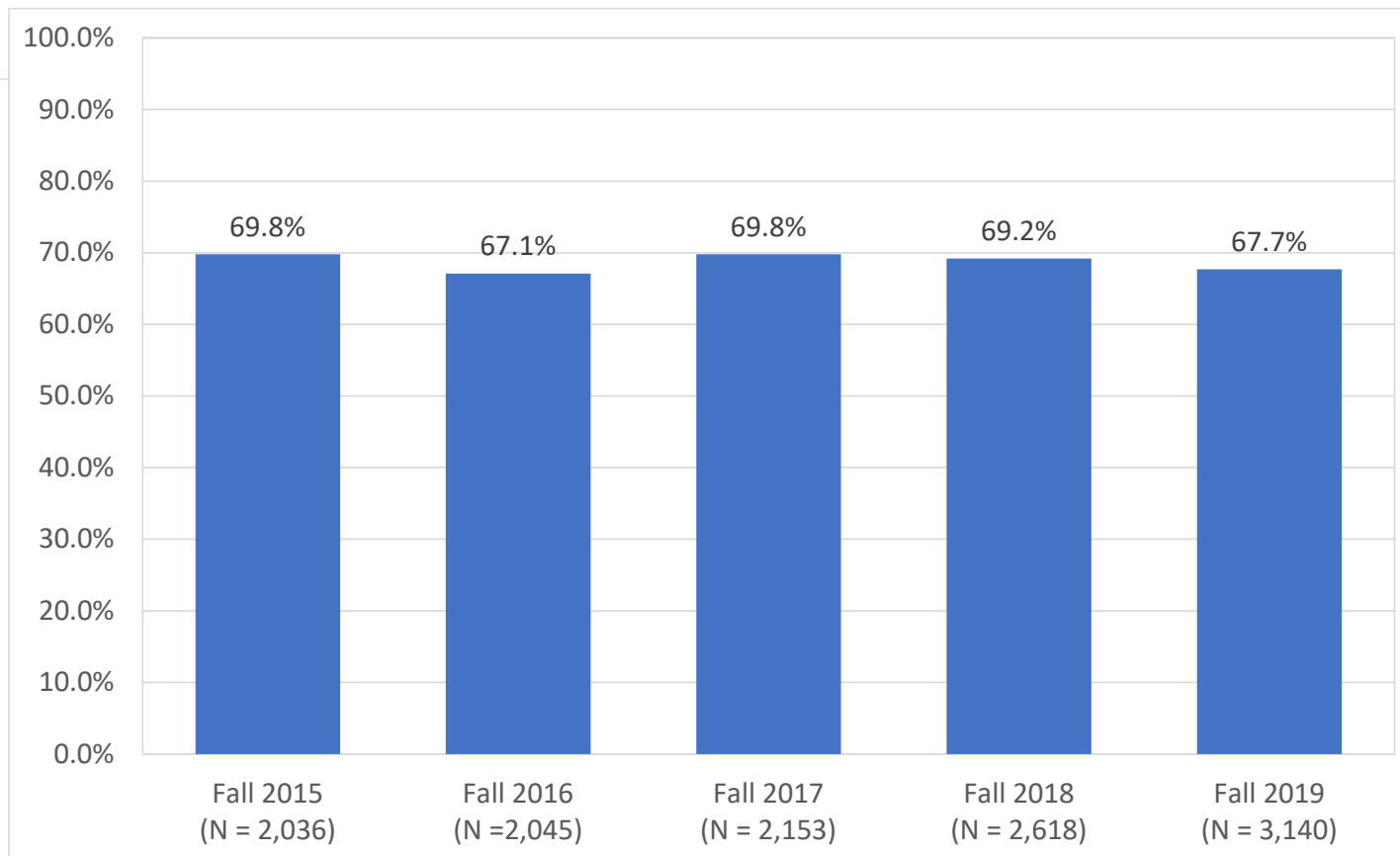

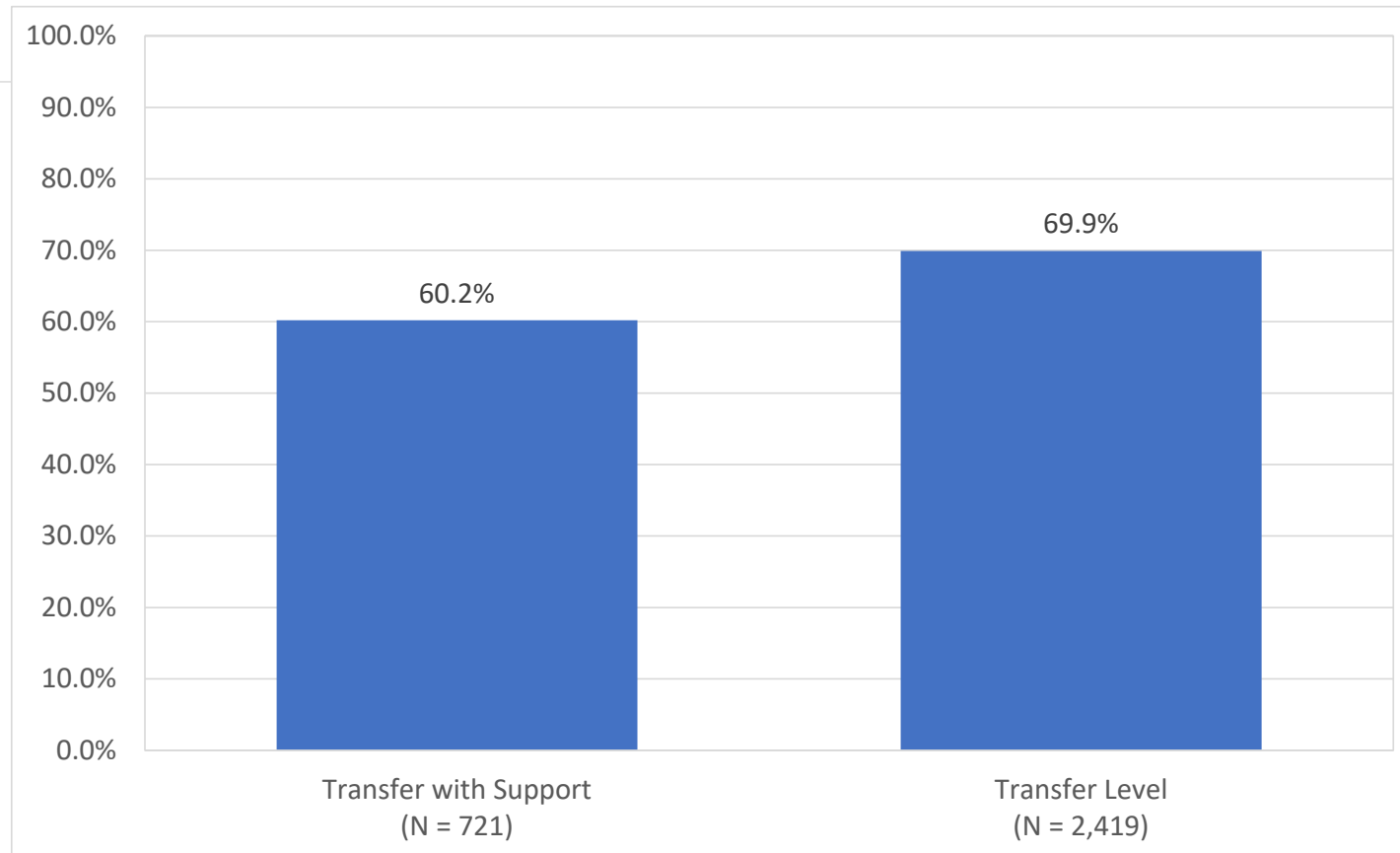

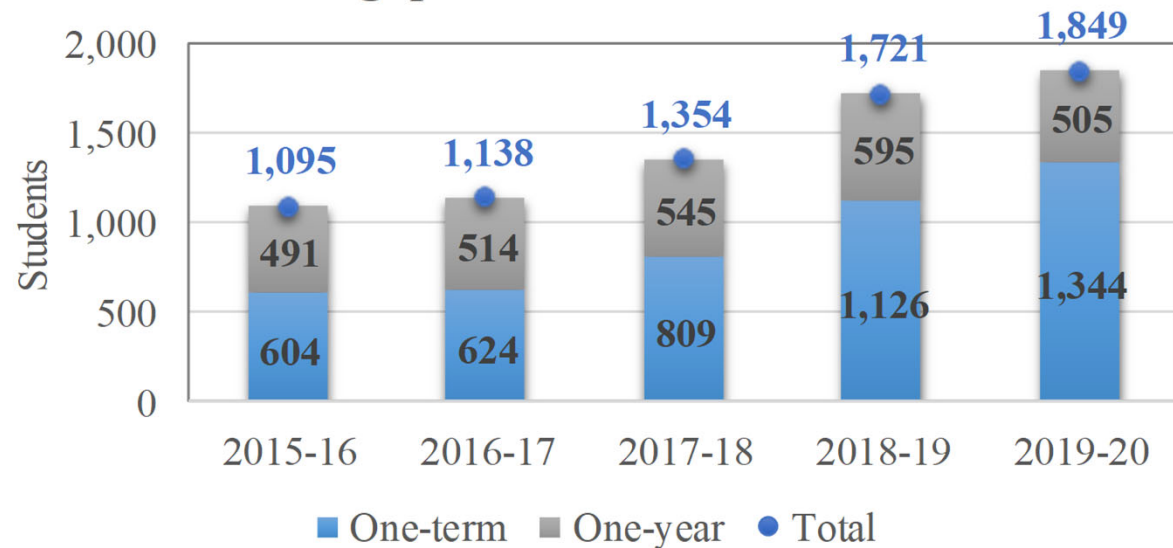

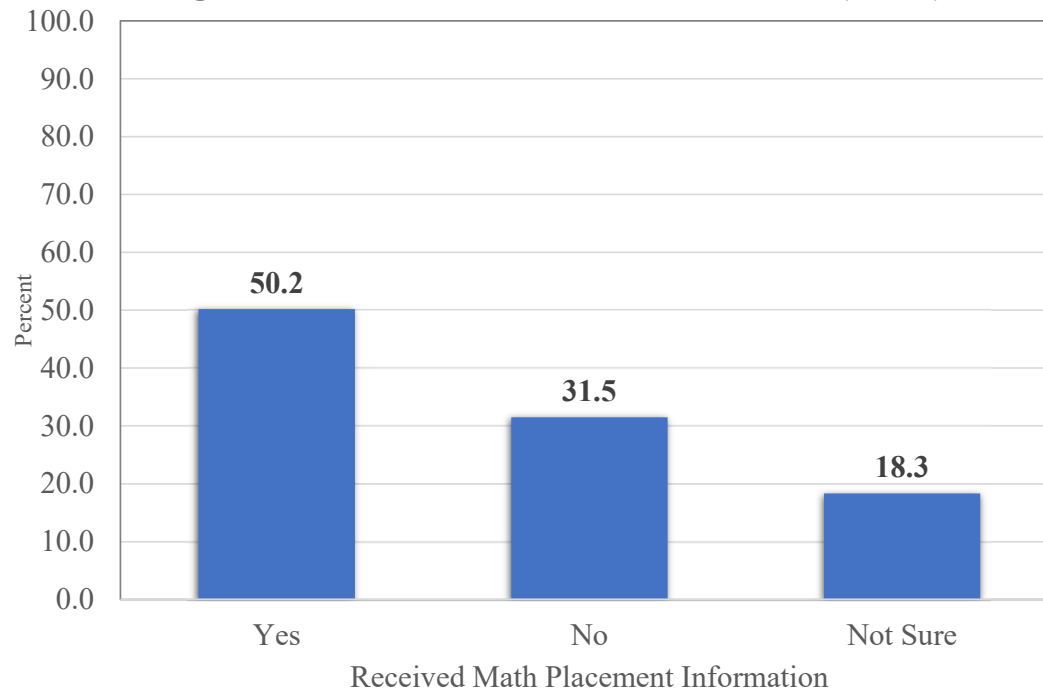

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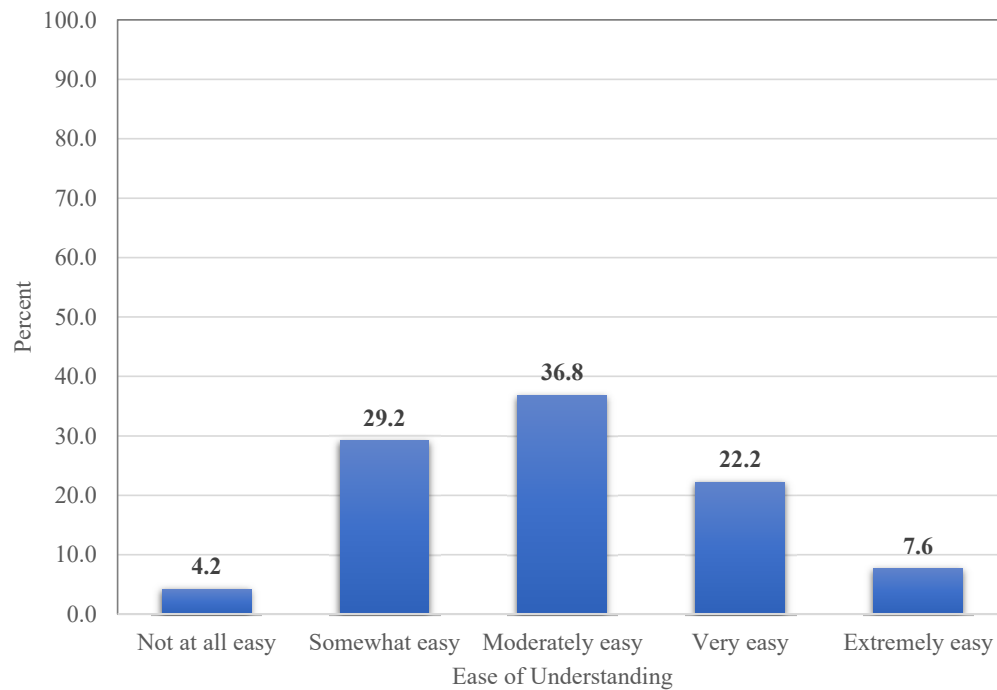

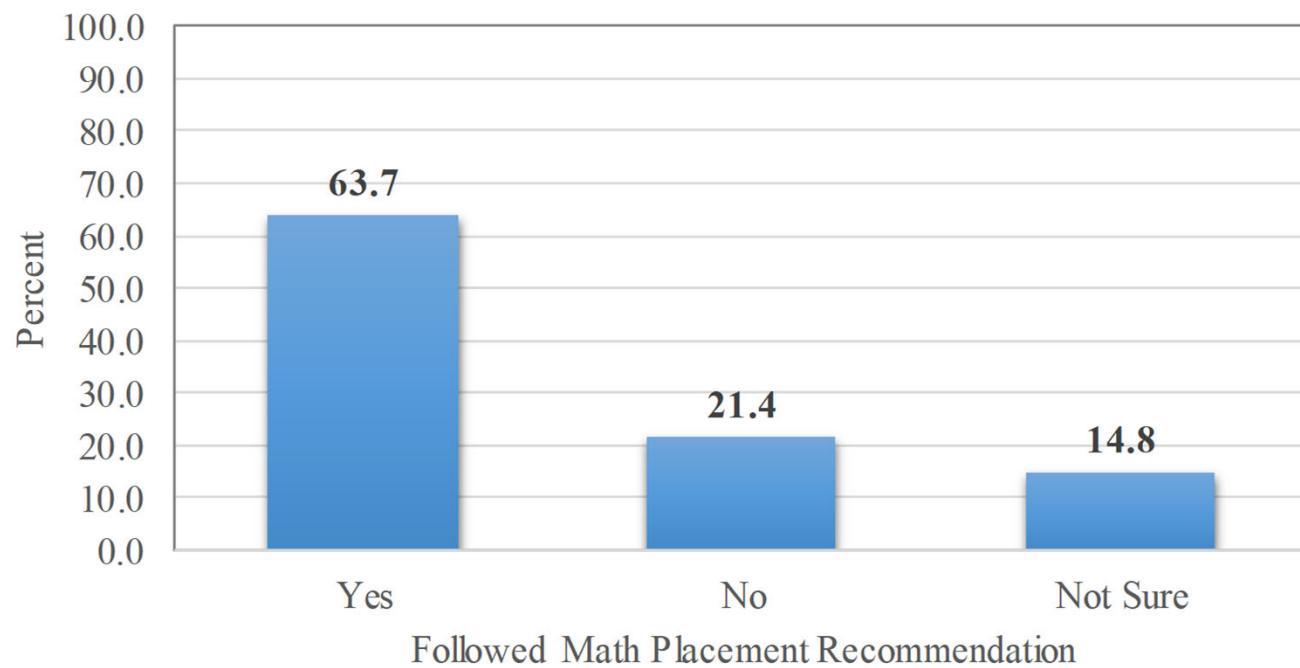

"have a meeting with a counselor to see what class we should take & understand why"

"set up counseling, or take a math placement test"

"In the future you could try making it easier to understand what math classes we need to take in the future. Because I was put into Group K and it was hard to find information about what math classes go with that group."

"very hard time finding the correct classes to choose from and then selecting it, hard time even knowing which classes applied to me until i spoke with a counselor"

"Perhaps having a one on one with us and explaining which math class would be the best for us to take."

"Maybe describe what each class is about and/or why we were selected for that math class."

"Maybe if we could have a automatic email emailed to us to tell us what specific class we need to take and what the different math levels are and what they mean for our future"

"If there were an email or notification with more information on how to find your math class, how to register and a overview of what to expect"

"Make it known that there is a quiz or something we should take to find out. Or have our high school tell us which math we should take or just give a detailed explanation of each math class and let us decide."

"Explaining what math courses there are and why you recommend the one you do."

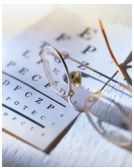
"It only told me I was in math group L, but it would help a lot more if it was more specific. What course names are in "math group L" or what kind of math classes I'd need for this, etc."

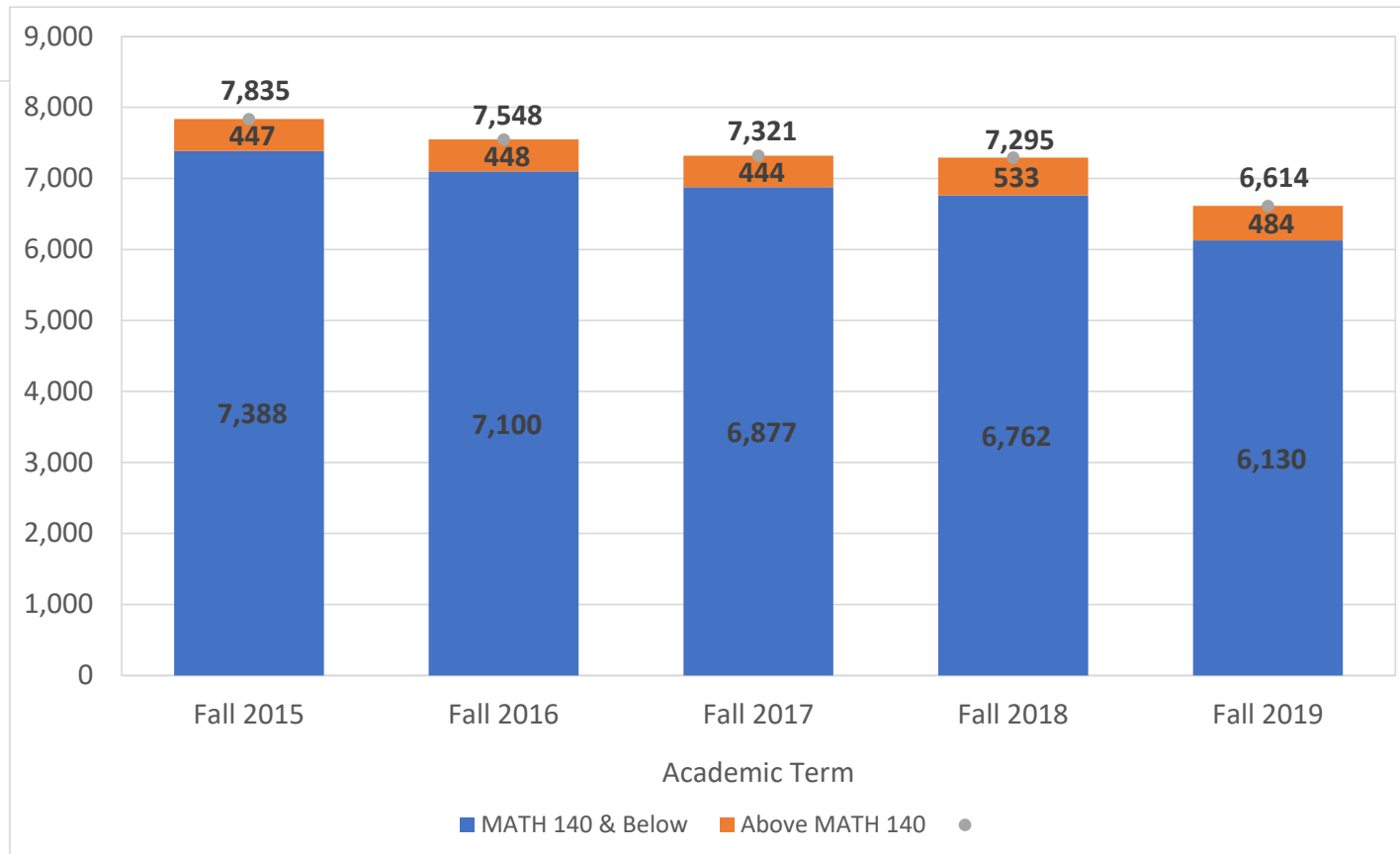

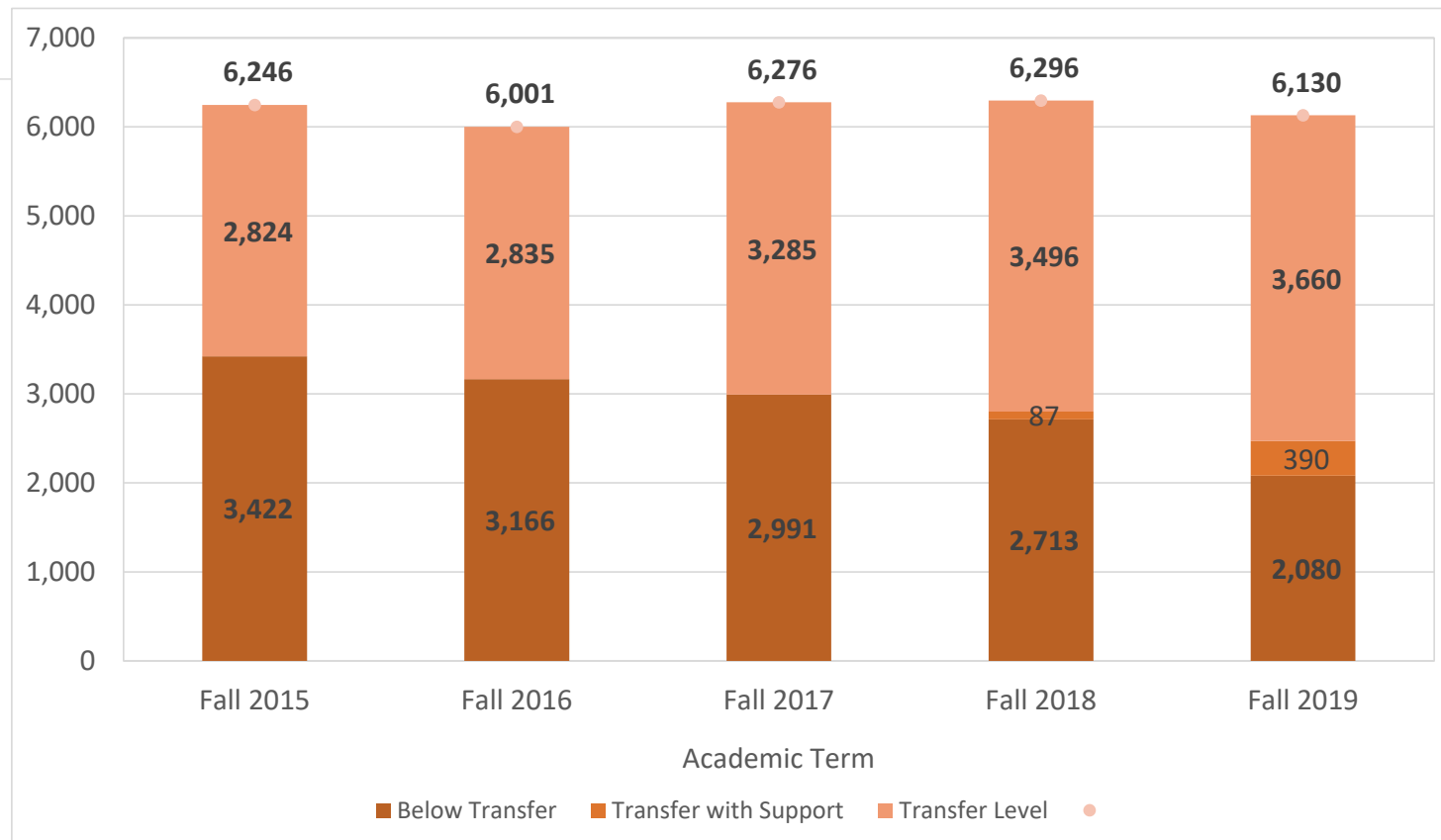

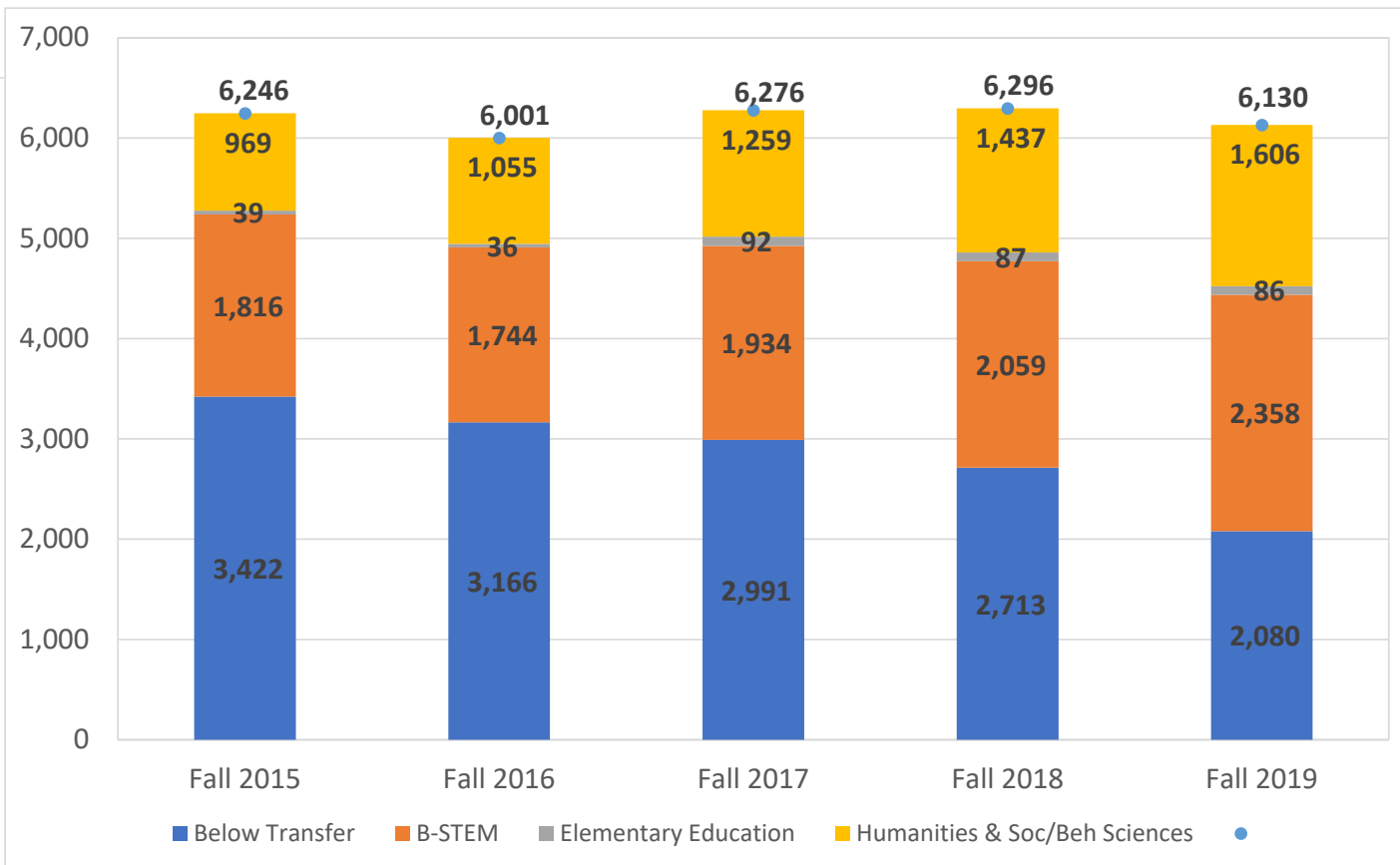
Math Enrollments by Transfer Level

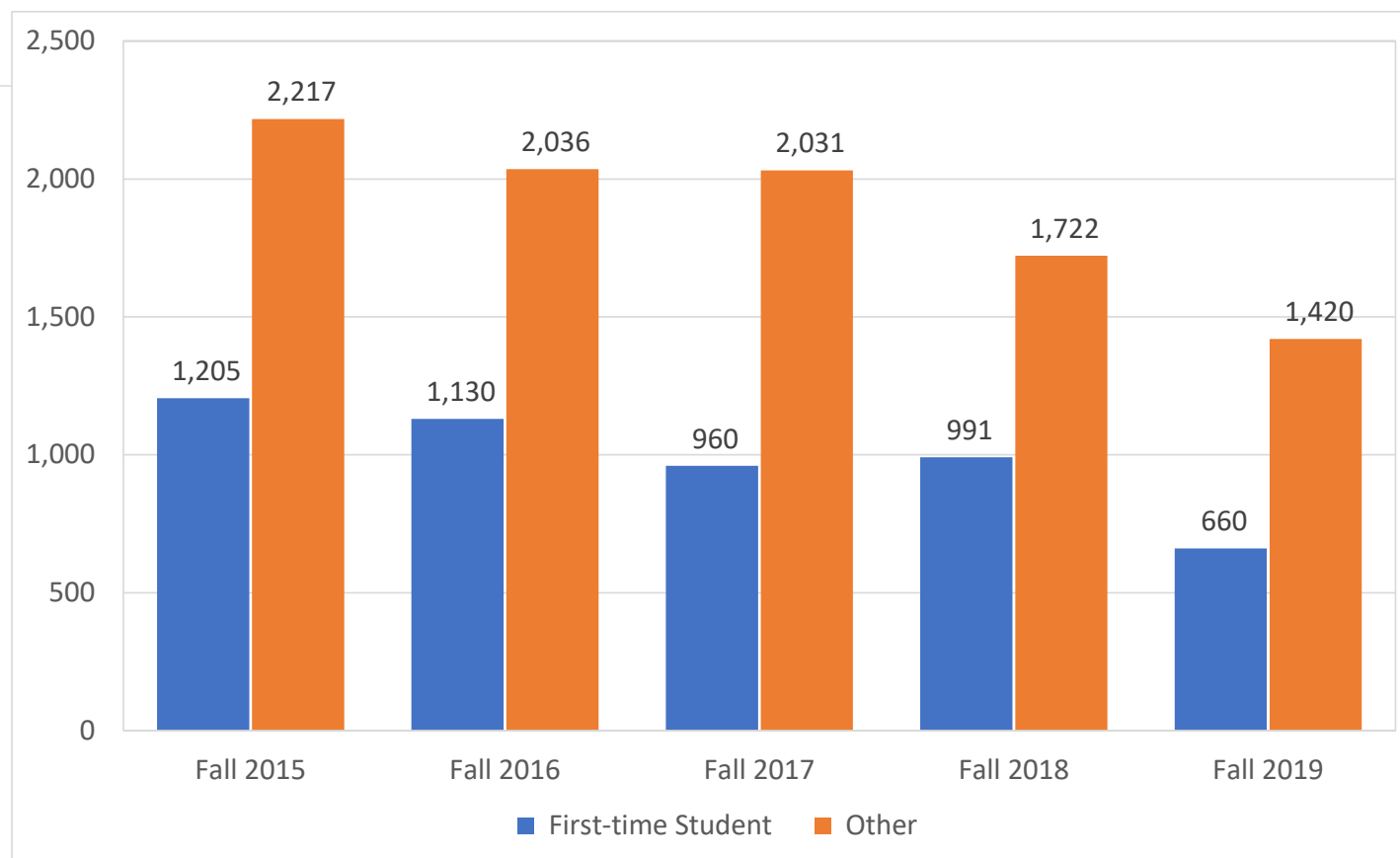
Math Enrollments by Pathway

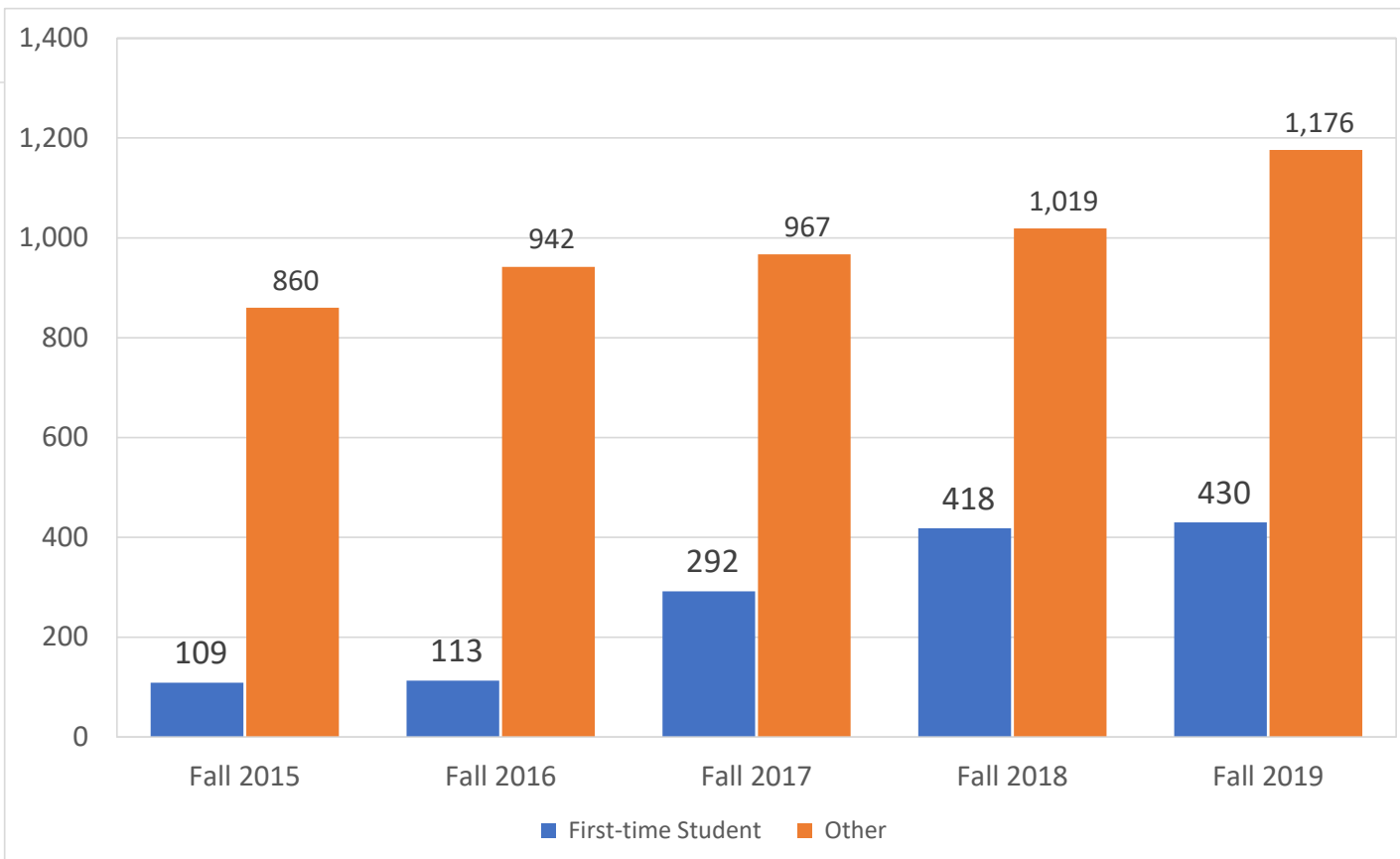

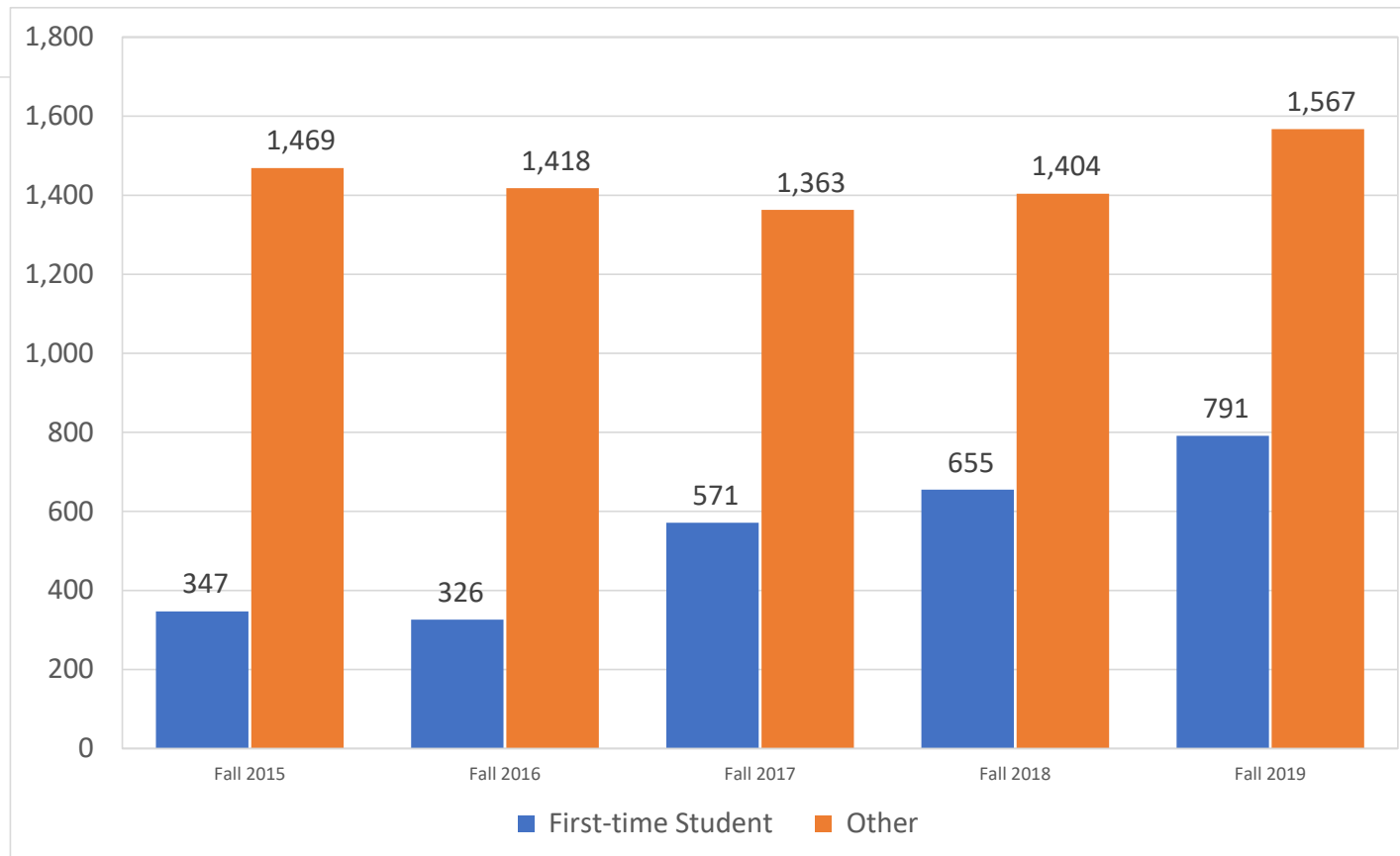
H&SBS Pathway Math Enrollments by Enrollment Status

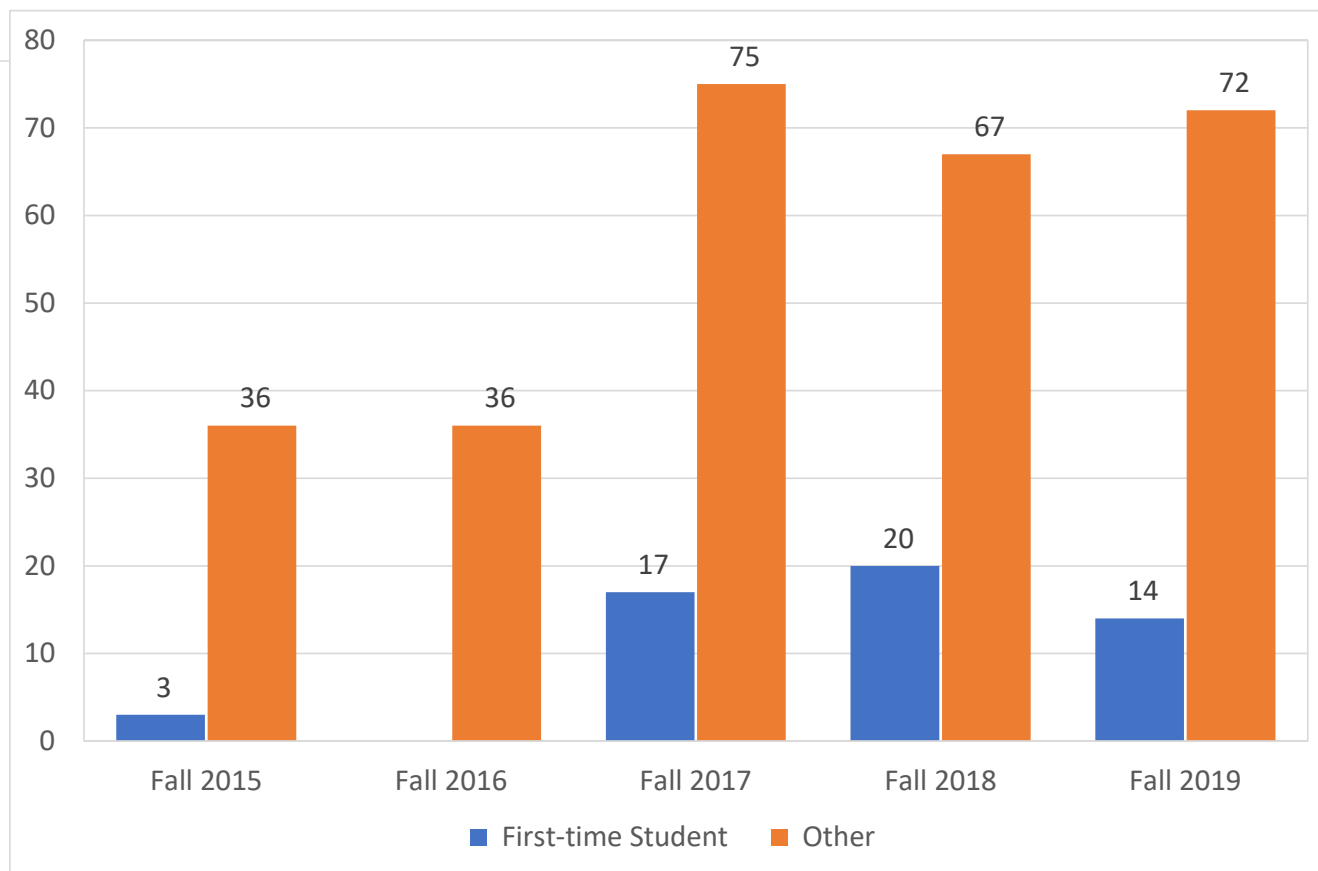

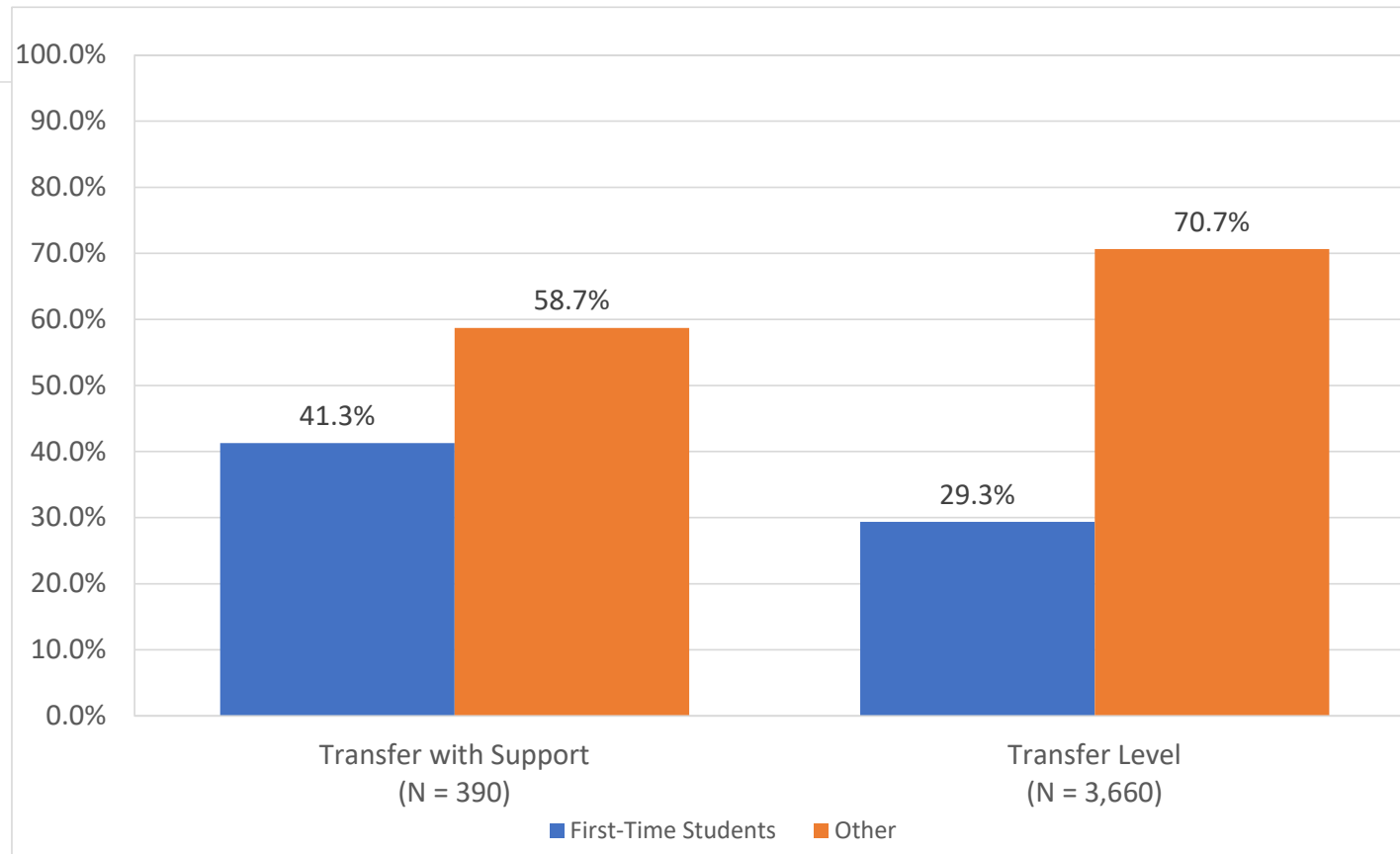
Elementary Ed Path Math Enrollments by Enrollment Status

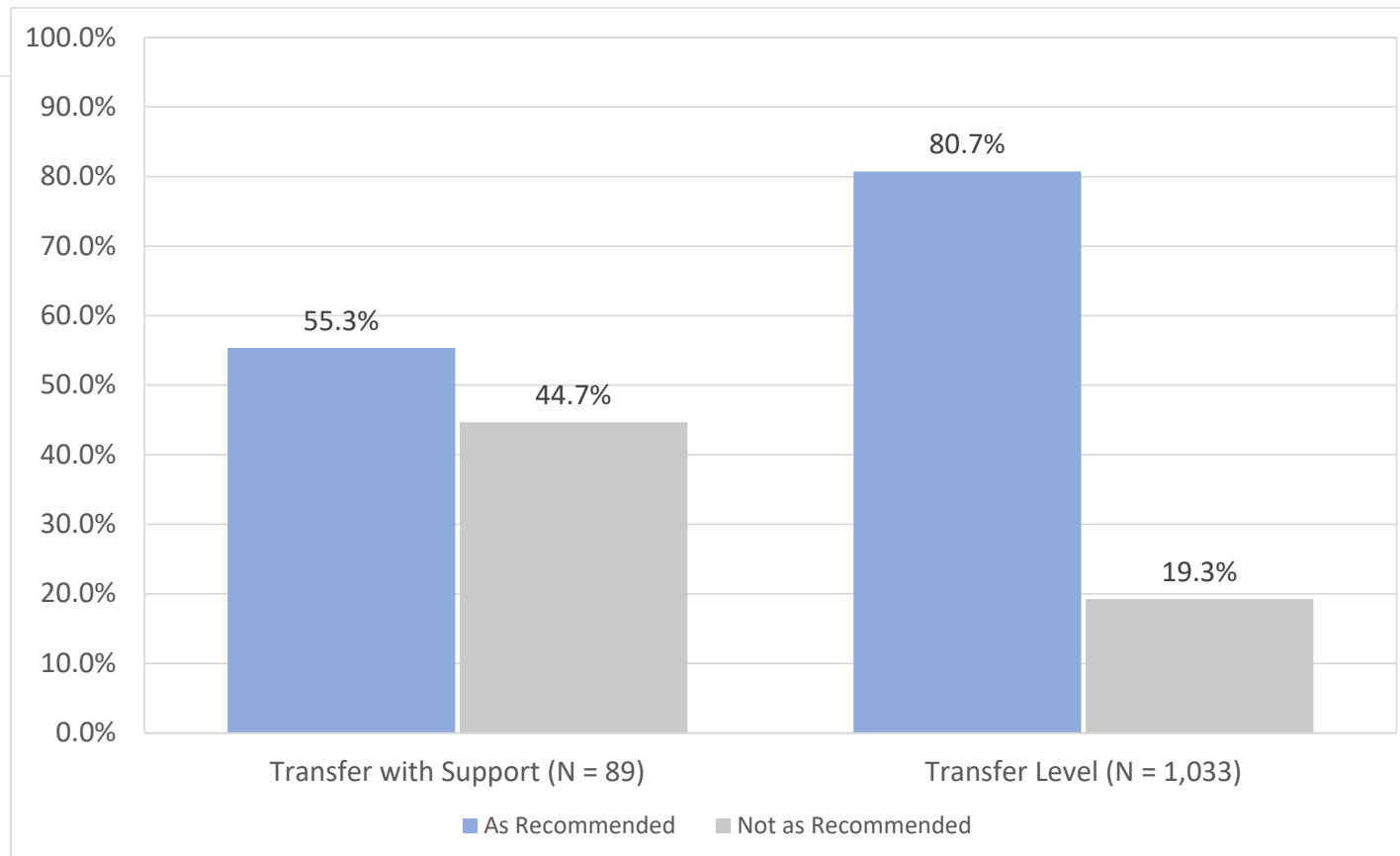
Fall 2019 Transfer Level Math Enrollments by Enrollment Status

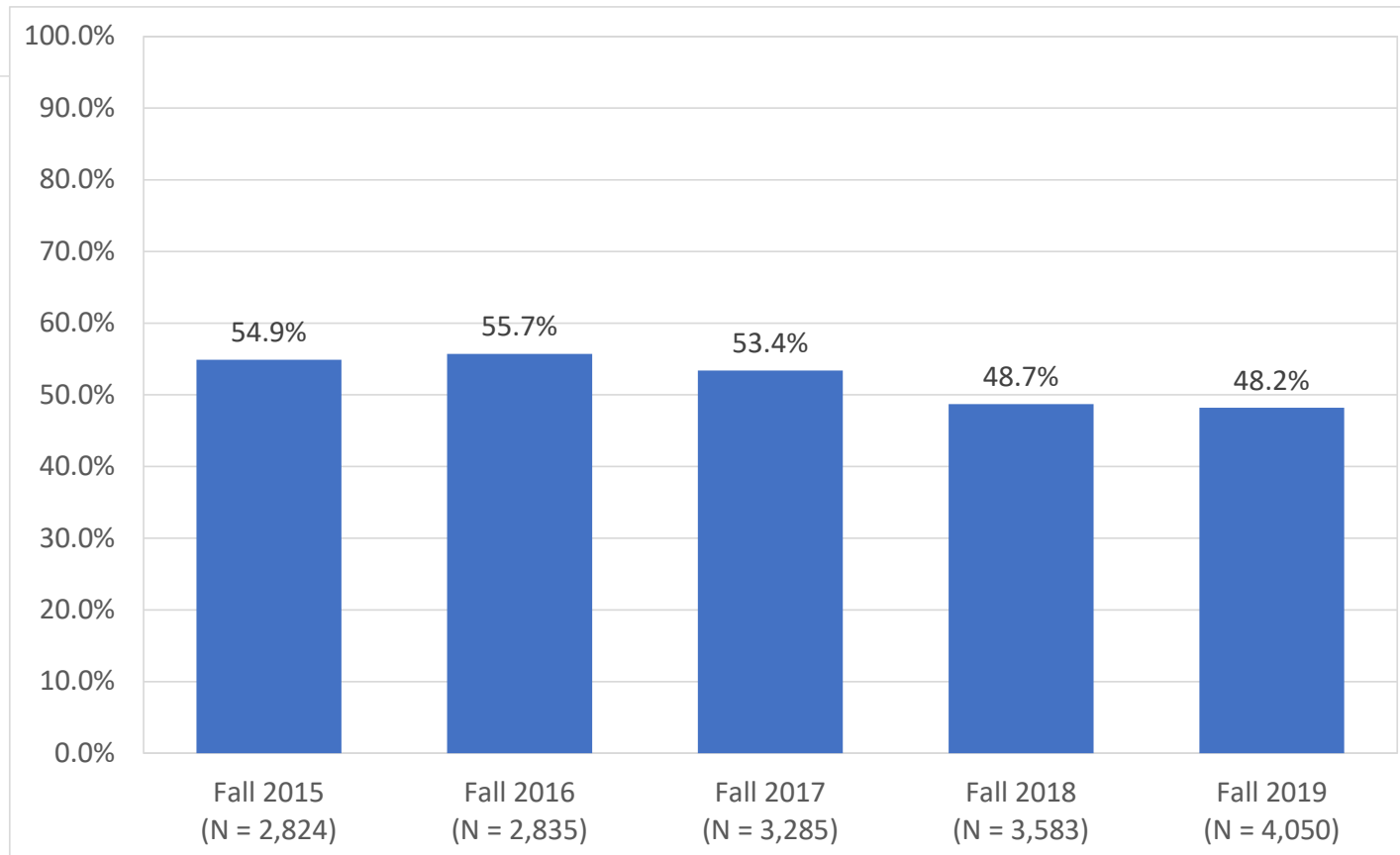

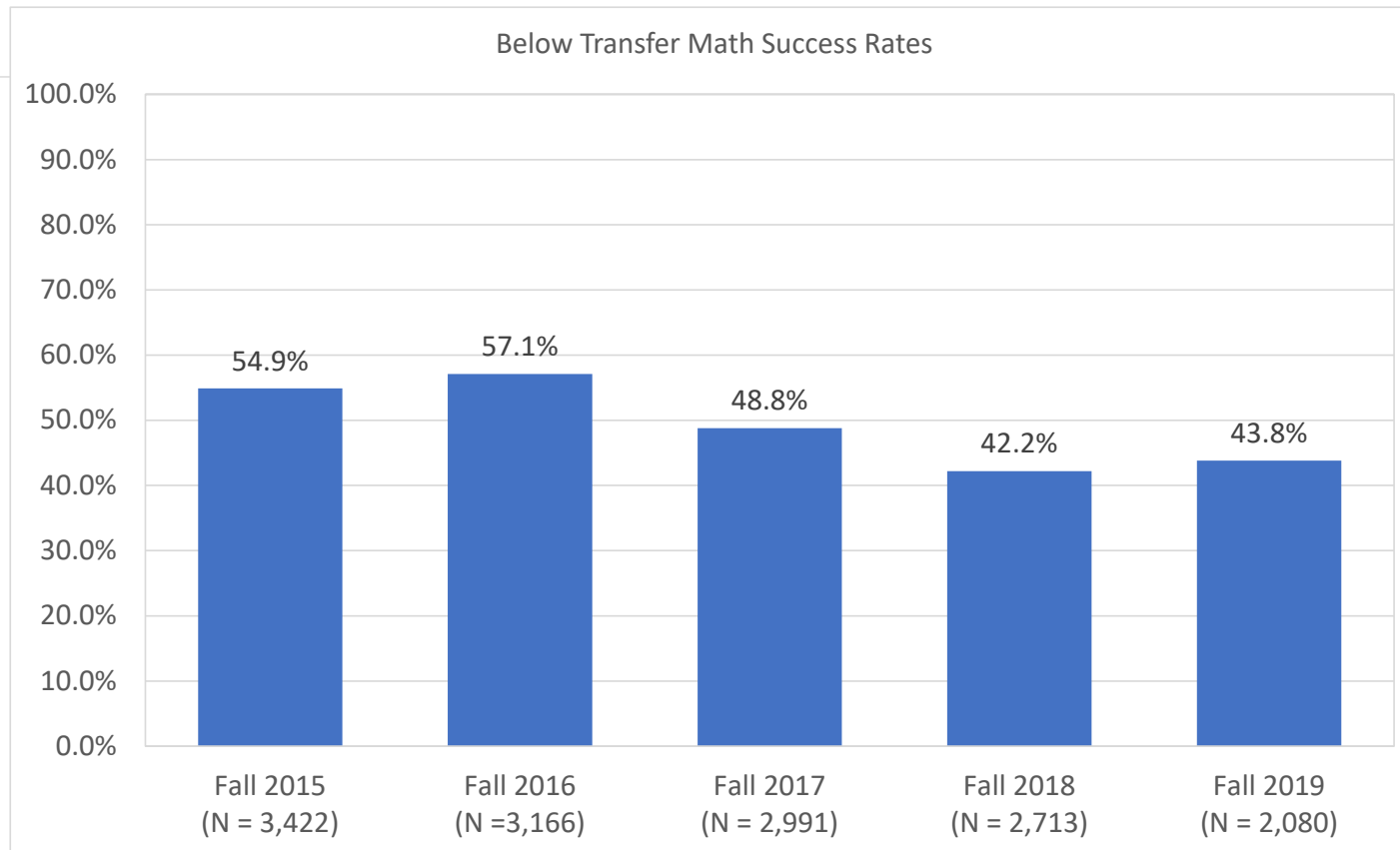

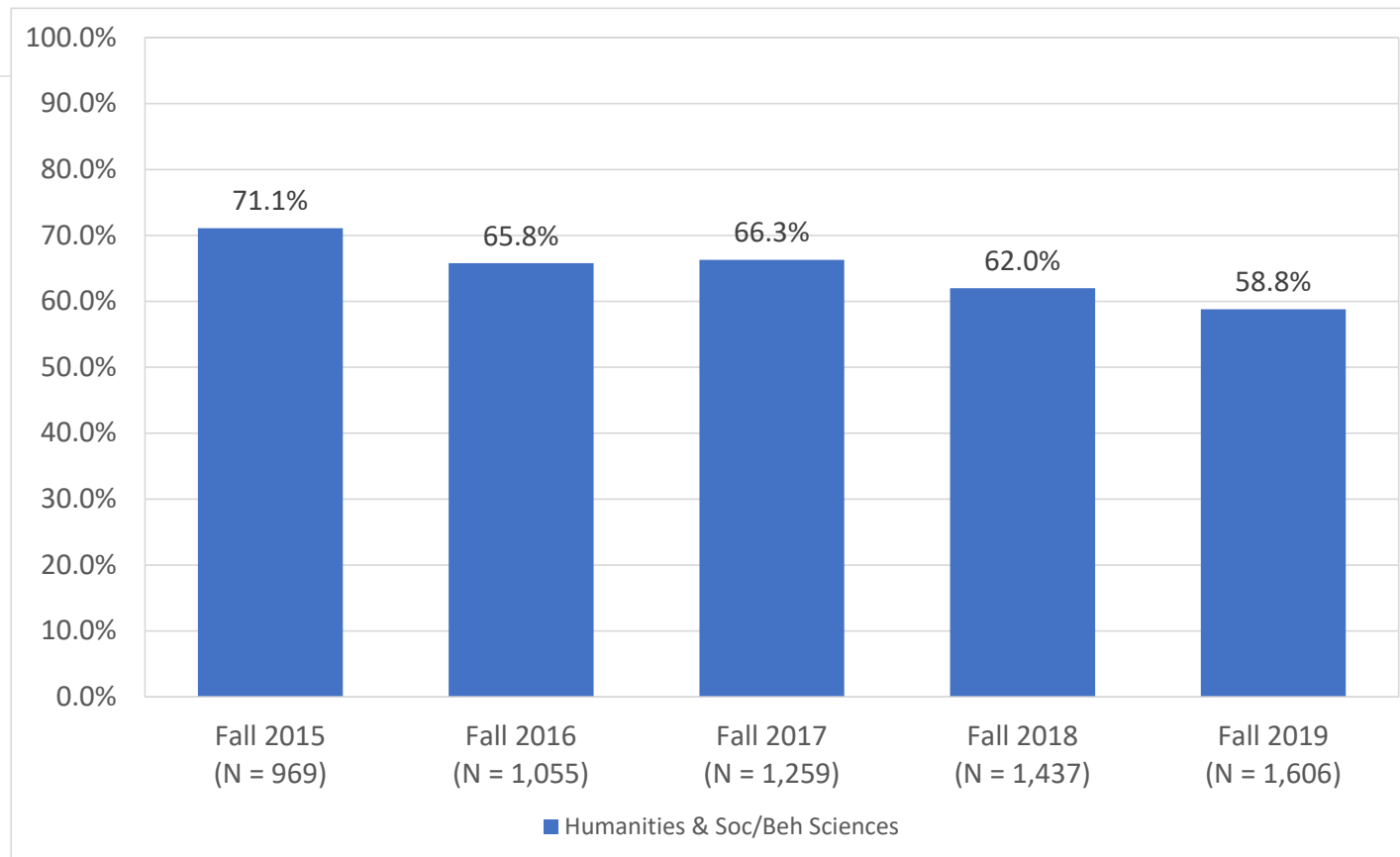

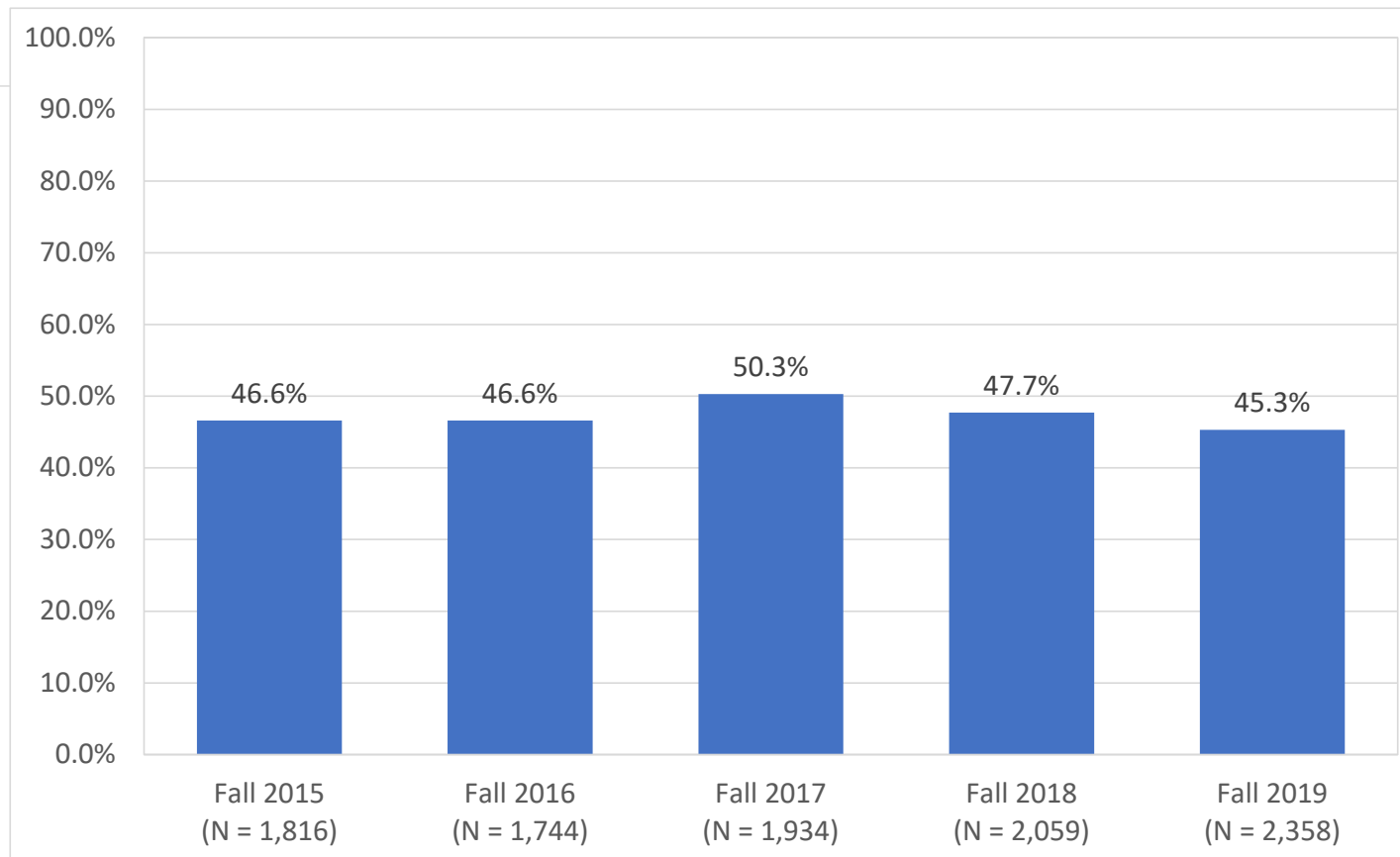

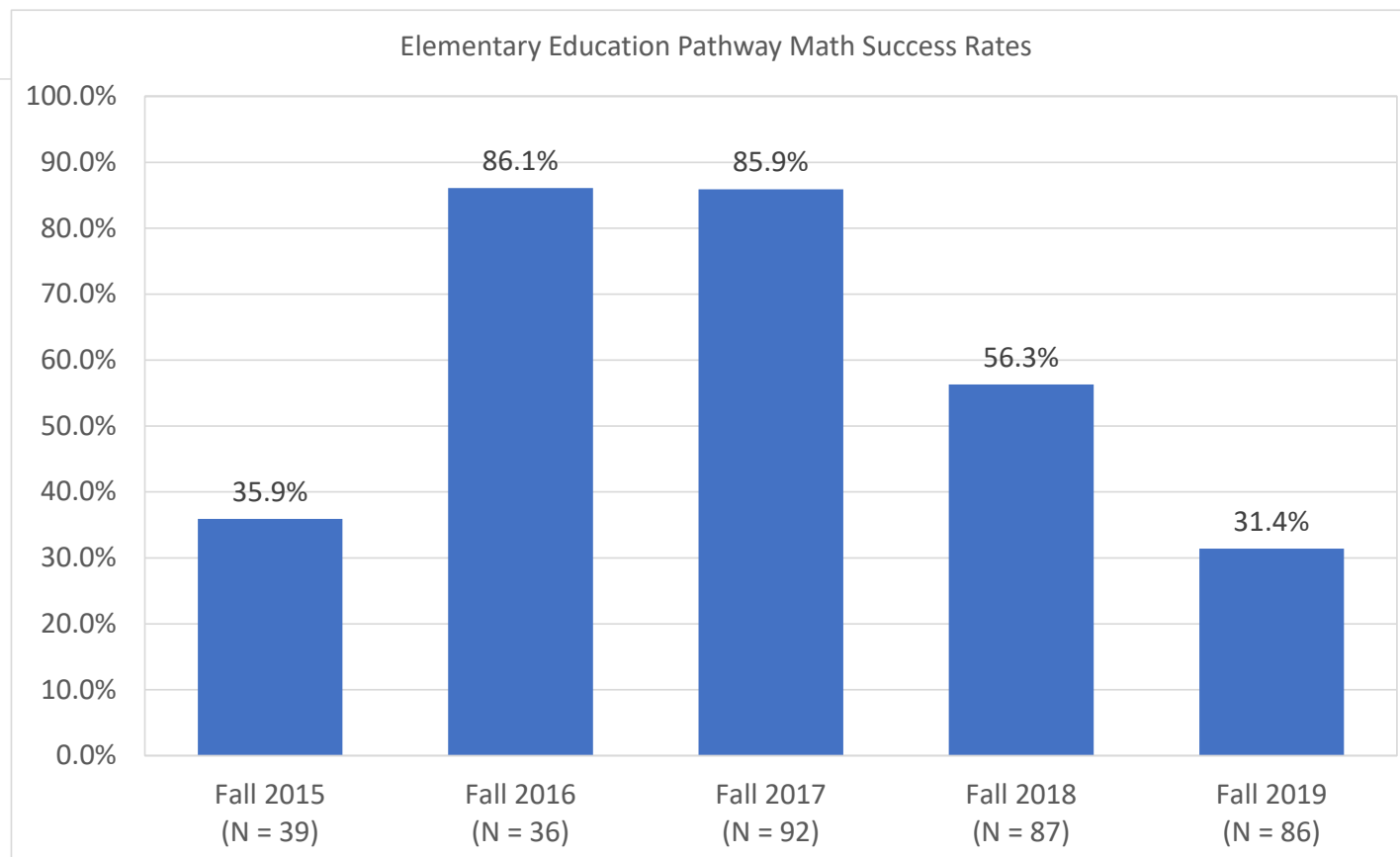

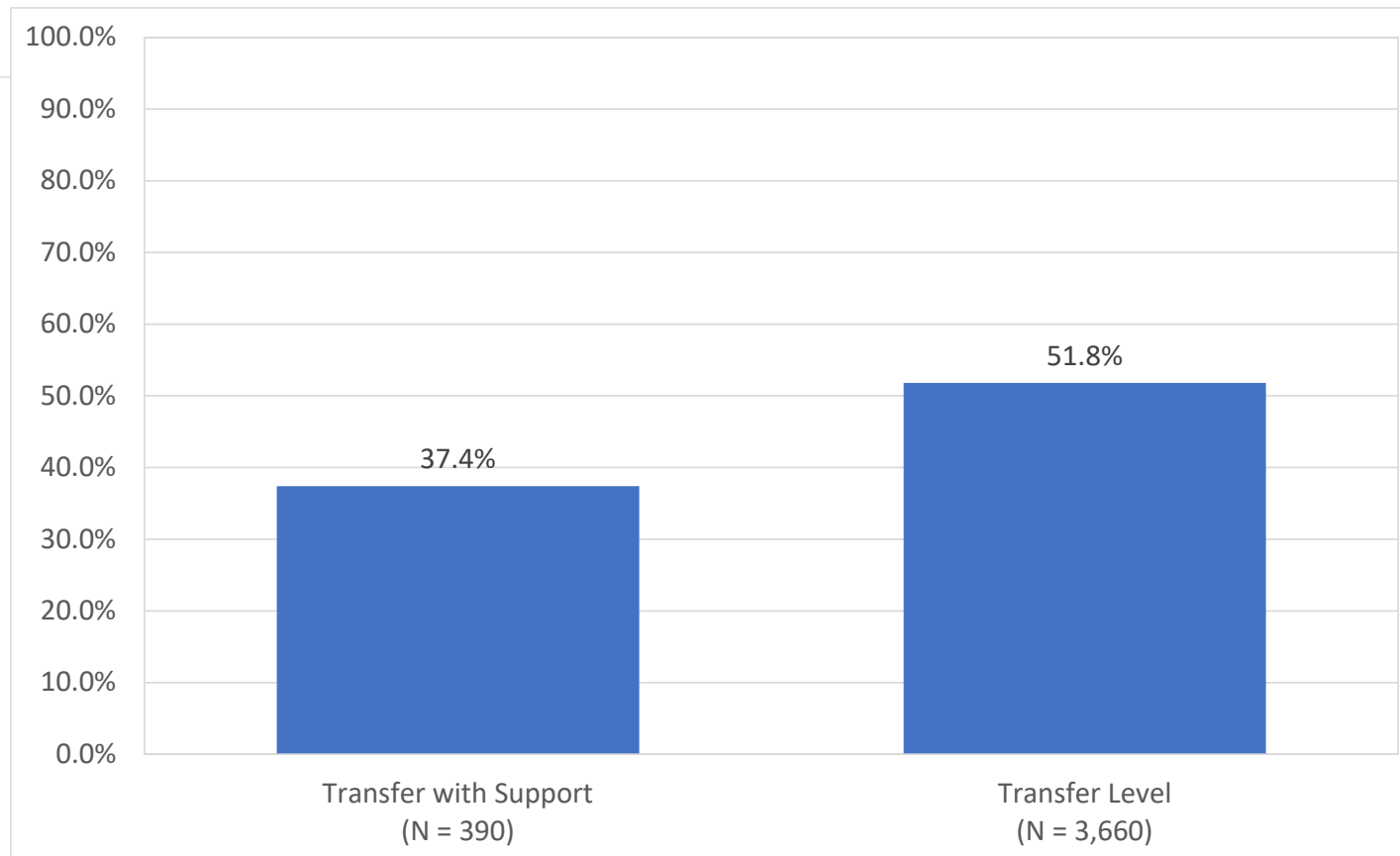

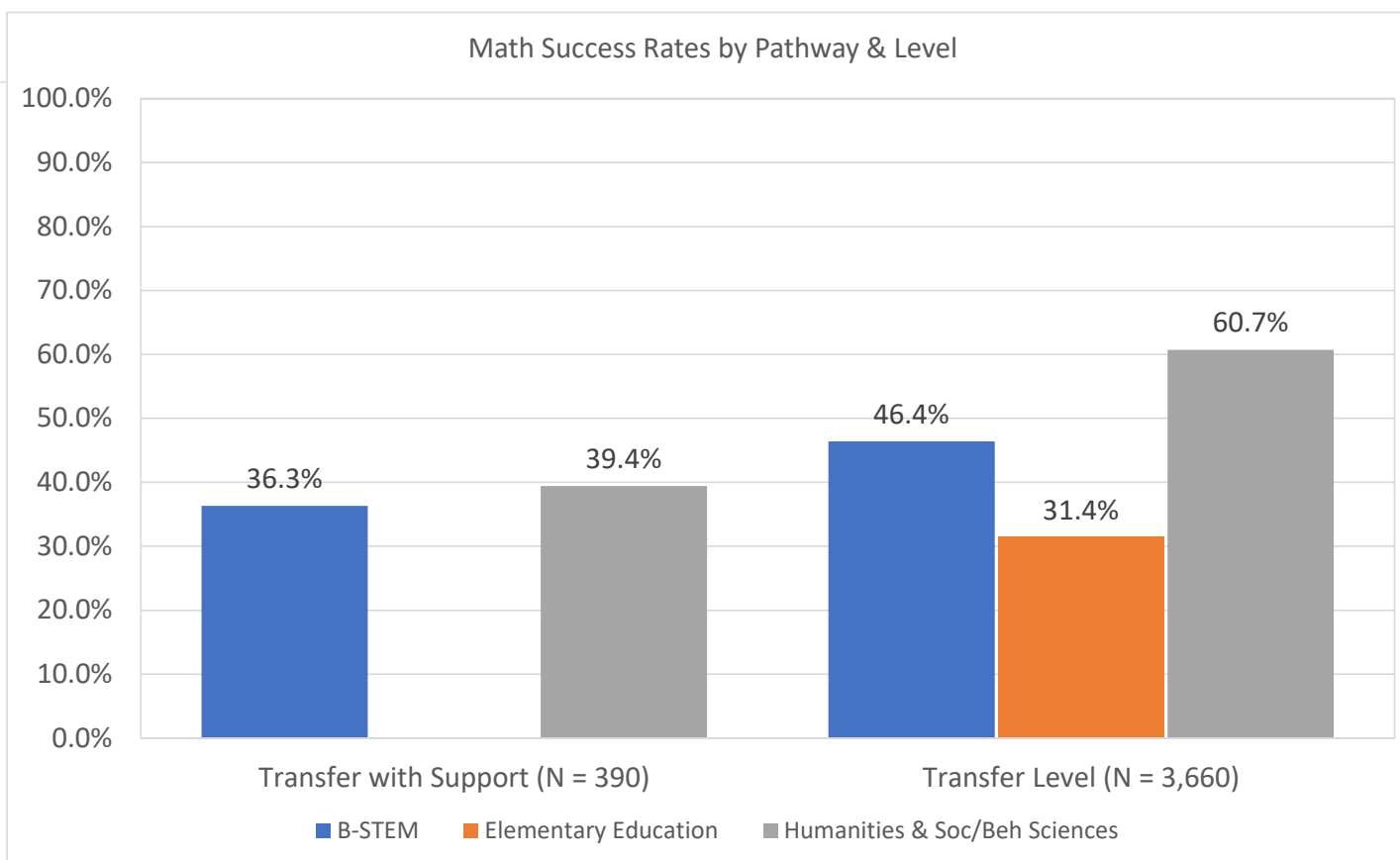
Fall 2019 Math Success Rates by Transfer Level

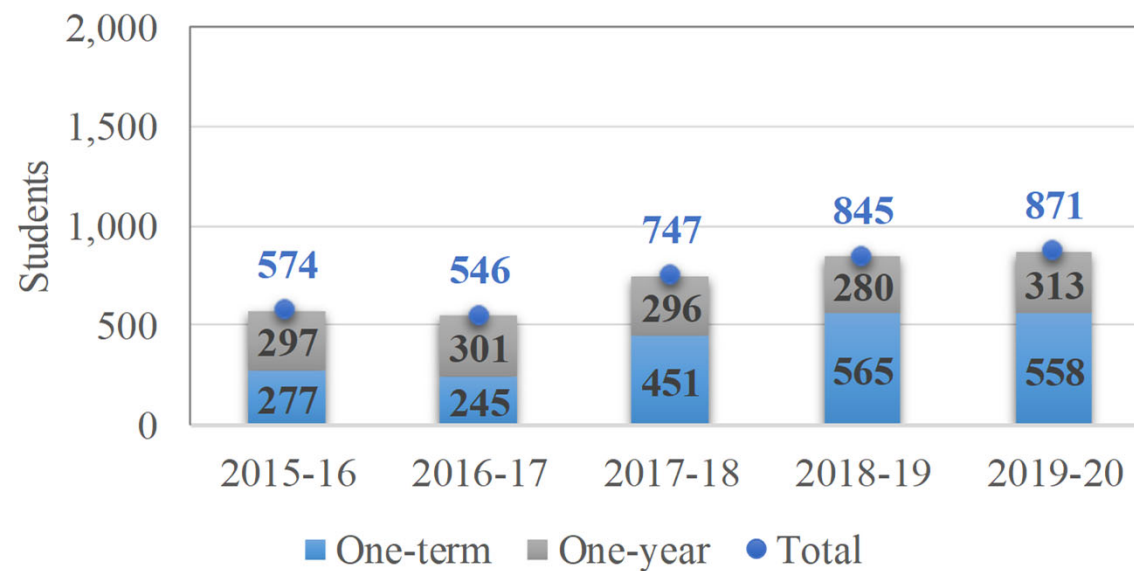
