A Humanities course is required but not used to calculate GPA. This applies to military spouse.</li> <li>b) Provide a copy of a DSPS evaluation, letter from a Physician, or letter from Veterans’ Affairs.</li> <li>c) Provide a letter of eligibility/award of Financial Aid, CCPG, Federal Pell Grant, EOPS, Cal Works, EDD, Cal Fresh, Medi-Cal, etc.</li> <li>d) Provide a written statement, 100 words minimum.</li> <li>e) Provide a letter signed by employer on company letterhead verifying dates of employment or submit this <a href="#">Optional Form</a>. Examples include: being a single parent, having a deployed spouse, being a family caregiver, recent death of a family member, personal medical or financial issues.</li> <li>h) Provide a copy of the card indicating refugee status</li> </ol>

<p>8. Test of Essential Academic Skills = TEAS</p> <p>Version 7 is the current version. We do not accept outdated versions.</p>	<p>32 points maximum</p>	<p>8. <b>Composite score must be 62% or higher.</b> <i>Provide documentation of all version 7 exam attempts.</i></p> <p>If unsuccessful on the first exam attempt, you must complete a TEAS remediation and can re-take the exam after 30 days.</p> <p>To improve on the first successful exam attempt and earn more points, you must wait 2 years after your exam date to re-take the exam.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>95 - 100% = 32 points</li> <li>90 - 94.9% = 30 points</li> <li>85 - 89.9% = 28 points</li> <li>80 - 84.9% = 26 points</li> <li>75 - 79.9% = 24 points</li> <li>70 - 74.9% = 21 points</li> <li>65 - 69.9% = 18 points</li> <li>62 - 64.9% = 15 points</li> </ul>
