

# **Early Start**

## Steps to Cross Enroll 1. Make sure you are eligible. 2. Choose a course. 3. Obtain approval from your home campus and the course **E** instructor. 4. Submit the completed application to the SDSU Office of the Registrar. 5. Review SDSU policies, procedures, and resources. 6. Pay applicable SDSU fees.

The Cross Enrollment Program is open to undergraduate students without a prior bachelors degree. If you are an ADN student with a prior bachelors degree **please refer to this site**.

To be eligible, you must:

Have completed at least one term at your home campus as an admitted student\* Have a grade point average of 2.0 or higher for all college work completed Have paid tuition and fees at your home campus for the current term

Have completed appropriate academic preparation as determined by SDSU

Meet California residency requirements as determined by your home campus

Be in good academic standing at SDSU

2. Choose a Course

Step 2: Choose the Course in the Following Sequence

- NURS 312: Nursing Professionalism (3 units offered Fall and Spring Semesters)
- NURS 307W: Research, Evidence Based Practice, and Writing for Nurses (3 units – offered Fall and Spring Semesters)
- NURS 320: Health Assessment and Health Promotion for RN to BS (4 units offered Fall and Spring Semesters)

### Optional

• NURS 350: Womens Health Across the Lifespan (3units – offered Fall, Spring, and Summer Semesters) Optional course to satisfy a GE requirement may be taken at any time.

## **Steps to Cross Enroll**

4. Submit the completed application to the SDSU Office of the Registrar

**Submit** your approved form to the Office of the Registrar. The Office of the Registrar will review your request within 3 business days. You will be notified by email of your enrollment status.

Applications for Cross Enrollment are accepted beginning one-week prior to the start of classes through the end of the fifth day of classes.

5. Review SDSU Policies, Procedures, and Resources

Once the Office of the Registrar has confirmed your enrollment, you are a student at SDSU and held to campus policies and deadlines.

All SDSU communication will be sent to your SDSUid email. Contact the **SDSU Computing Hub Helpdesk** for assistance with your SDSUid.

Familiarize yourself with the **Academic Calendar** for the term in which you are enrolling.

Review SDSU's Student and Academic Policies.

Cross enrolled students who wish to drop a course must contact the **SDSU Office of the Registrar** before the schedule adjustment deadline to drop a course.

Review the policies and procedures for withdrawing.

Course forgiveness can be requested through your **SDSU WebPortal** if you previously took the Cross Enrollment course at SDSU as a matriculated student and left SDSU in good academic standing.

Cross enrollment courses earn SDSU residence credit. The associated units and grade points will be included in the SDSU grade point average and will affect **SDSU academic status**.

Participation in student activities or use of the SDSU student union is subject to limitations set by SDSU.

Use of SDSU Student Health Services is limited to treatment of emergencies. You are responsible for SDSU campus parking fees and regulations. SDSU parking permits are available through the **Parking Portal**.

#### Step 6: Pay Applicable SDSU Fees

You will not be charged additional state university fees. However, there is a non-refundable \$52 administration fee. You may also be responsible for additional course-specific fees may apply, such as lab or materials fees.

You are responsible for payment of all fees even if you drop or withdraw from the course.

Financial aid is available only through your home campus. Students eligible for Veterans, Rehabilitation, Social Security, and other federal, state or county benefits must secure eligibility certification through their home campus. Units taken at both campuses may be combined to establish financial aid eligibility.

## SDSU Upper Division General Education Requirements

- You must complete Section IV, Explorations of Human Experience to satisfy your General Education requirements at SDSU. Complete one course from categories A, B, and C (9 units).
- Select one course from Category A. (3 units)
- Suggested course from Category B HHS 350: Applied International Health and Human Services (3 units) or PSY 351: Psychology of Personality (3 units)
- Required course from Category C PHIL 330: Medical Ethics (3 units)

- With Open University, you can participate in SDSU- without applying to San Diego State University.

# **Ready to Transfer into the RN to BS in Nursing program?**

## Application Process

 Submit an application via <u>Cal State Apply</u> and complete <u>SDSU's Supplemental</u> <u>Application</u>. SDSU will accept Fall and Spring admission applications from October 1 – November 30.

## IMPORTANT

If you are interested in applying for spring admissions, please email <a href="mailto:nursing@sdsu.edu">nursing@sdsu.edu</a>

- RN to BS Students first meet all requirements for completion of the Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN) or Diploma in Nursing program from a regionally accredited program.
- Program length may vary. Most RN to BS students can complete the Bachelor of Science degree at SDSU within fifteen months.

# **Second Degree Bachelor's Students**

- RN to BS program offered at SDSU's San Diego and Imperial Valley campuses.
- Waivers for second baccalaureate students:
  - International experience requirement waived.
  - SDSU Upper Division General Education Requirements waived.
- Second Degree RN to BS Students must meet:
  - Requirements for completion of ADN or Diploma in Nursing from a regionally accredited program.
  - Hold a Bachelor's Degree.
- After RN licensure, students enter SDSU RN to BS program.
- Second baccalaureate students progress faster due to waived requirements.
- Apply Fall before graduation from ADN program, or after graduation if preferred by student.

# Second Degree Bachelor's Students: Courses : non nursing field with an ADN

- If you are an RN with a bachelor's degree in a non-nursing field, you may be eligible for our Master's degree program in the Leadership specialty. Please see our <u>Graduate Program website</u>.

## • How long will the RN to BS in Nursing Program take?

Most students will complete the program in twelve to fifteen months. Those who take courses through cross enrollment and open university may complete as soon as 1-2 semesters.

## • What if I have my Bachelor's Degree in another field?

Second baccalaureate degree students are able to quickly move through our program within one year, and the general education courses and international requirement are waived.

## • How much does it cost to attend SDSU?

The cost is about \$13,000 including General Education courses. Information about the cost of attending SDSU.
