Composite score must be 62% or higher. <i>Provide documentation of all version 7 exam attempts.</i> If unsuccessful on the first exam attempt, you must complete a TEAS remediation and can re-take the exam after 30 days. <p>95 - 100% = 32 points 90 - 94.9% = 30 points 85 - 89.9% = 28 points 80 - 84.9% = 26 points 75 - 79.9% = 24 points 70 - 74.9% = 21 points 65 - 69.9% = 18 points 62 - 64.9% = 15 points</p>
