Questions to ask of the Benefits Committee at its next meeting

- ➤ Retiree Benefits issues to be discussed with the PACRA general membership at the April 17, 2025 Annual Meeting
- ➤ Great news that, because of President Biden's signing of the SSFA (Social Security Fairness Act) on January 5, 2025, our PACRA members are receiving the lump sum this month (as well as our CalRTA members)!!
- ➤ Review of the March 6, 2025, meeting with Wendy, Christine, Becky, JudyC, and Jayne re the progress in the Scripps/Anthem negotiations:

Currently, Anthem is not giving the best information—they are training people and some are still learning. Scripps is complicating the issue with multiple emails. For retirees who are 65+, have Medicare as primary coverage, and see a Medicare provider, there is no change in your coverage.

Directly quoted from an HR email dated March 5, 2025 sent to PACRA Board members prior to the March 6 meeting:

65+ EGWP members still continue to have access to Scripps's providers, including "Scripps Memorial Hospital Encinitas," because Medicare is primary; both Scripps Medical Group and Scripps Memorial Hospital Encinitas currently participate with Medicare. Therefore, Anthem treats the EGWP and Companion Care claims as in-network with Medicare. Use of Scripps is not an option for Active and <65 Retirees, except for emergencies or those approved for treatments (Continuation of Coverage); EGWP members have more access to providers with their SISC EGWP and Companion Care plans.

... physicians can end their individual contracts with the medical group, typically with a 30-day notice. This type of action has nothing to do with the Anthem/Scripps contract; the provider leaving Scripps was the provider's individual decision. Therefore, members that see this provider received a letter so they could be informed and choose another provider with Scripps.

The Anthem Website mostly refers to active/<65 plans, and their information is more general and not always specific to our plan designs; please don't refer to the website for plan-specific details. Your (retiree) plan's *Evidence of Coverage (aka: EOC)* and benefit summaries, are best items to refer to—or members can call Anthem Customer Service for specific questions about their plans.

If Anthem is not covering our 20% coverage, call Wendy or Christine and they will contact Armando. (It is best to get an EOB (Explanation of Benefits) before a procedure to clarify any questions or concerns.)
