THE SUBJECT OF A SENTENCE...

Refers to who or what the sentence is about...

Just for fun, let's pick a subject and call him"Harry the Rooster."



THE VERB OF A SENTENCE



VERB: Refers to what the subject is doing.

Just for fun, let's have Harry do something.

Shall we give him a hammer?

TOOLS OF THE TRADE

Laying the Foundation:

Subject: Harry

the Rooster

Verb: Hammer

Building the Sentence:


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Harry the Rooster hammers.
