
Finding Videos in the Palomar College Library Collection

The library owns many films on a variety of subjects, available in DVD or VHS format. If you don't have a VHS player, the library has several that you can use. To search for films, go to the library's home page and open up the catalog. Click on the link Advanced Search. Type in your search terms and under type: select DVD. You do the same, selecting VHS as type. Most films will be located in the library's Circulating Media collection. Some films may be located at the Escondido Center Library, but they can be transferred for you to pick up at San Marcos. Please allow up to three days for inter-campus transfers. DVDs and VHS tapes can be checked out for one week at a time.



Video Databases

The library also has four video databases that would be useful. They're all available on the <u>list</u> of <u>databases</u>, under the general tab. Here are the names and descriptions.

Intelecom

INTELECOM is a hosted digital repository of academic video clips - streamed on demand, covering a variety of video collections including Biological Sciences, Oceanography, History,

Philosophy, Psychology, Political Science, Sociology, Health, and Environmental Studies. Videos may be downloaded and embedded in course software such as Blackboard.

Films on Demand

Films On Demand offers over 6,000 current, education streaming videos covering a variety of disciplines and subjects. Users can create personal playlists incorporating full-length videos or segments, and embed segments into courseware such as Blackboard. (NOTE: embedded videos only work with flash technology at this time, and will not work with Windows Media or Quicktime.) Some videos include interactive transcripts.

NBC Learn

NBC Learn includes thousands of videos, historic newsreels, primary source documents, and photographs from the NBC Archives going back to the beginning of film and television, as well as original resources, in a variety of disciplines and subjects.

Academic Video Online (aka VAST)

VAST is a multidisciplinary collection of streaming academic and educational videos.
