On a day / at a specific time	Tansel has ESL classes on Mondays and Wednesdays. She begins classes at 7:00 p.m.
From time to (or till or until) another time	Mariko class is from 9:00 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.
In number of hours, days, weeks, etc.	I will move into my new house in one month.
For a number of hours, days, weeks, etc.	I have been wishing for a new house for five years.
By a time / until a time	The teacher wants us to finish the test by 10:00. I took pronunciation classes until the end of Spring.
During the class, movie, event etc	The student slept during the teacher's lesson.
About / around + time	The class will start about 6:00 p.m.
In the past / future	In the past Martina did his homework on time.
