In English you cannot connect two sentences with a comma else you get a "comma splice." Also, you cannot write two sentences together without some type of coordinating conjunction else you get a "run-on-sentence".

Example of an incorrect sentence structure: Michael hates school he does his homework anyway.
(this is a run-on-sentence error)
This is also incorrect: Michael hates school, he does his homework anyway. (This is a comma splice error)

The only way to correct this sentence is to use "coordinating conjunctions" (But - or - yet - so - for - and - nor or $B-O-Y-S-F-A-N$ ) are used to connect two sentences.

But (means "in contrast or however")
Ex - Michael hates school, but he does his homework anyway.

Or (selection between two choices)
Ex - Michael will go to work, or he will stay home due to his cold.

Yet (means "despite all that happened before" )
Ex - Michael's eyes are so tired from driving all day, yet he keeps on driving to reach his destination.

So (means "as a result / for that reason")
Ex - Michael earns good money at work, so he enjoys working overtime to make more money.

For (another way of saying "because")
Ex - Michael wants to find a new job, for his current one doesn't allow him any vacation time.

And (means "additional information")
Ex - Michael loves his new job, and he is popular with his co-workers in the company.

Nor (means not one nor the other in a negative context - It's the negative of "or")
Ex - Michael didn't get a job promotion, nor did he get a raise in his salary.
Notice - there is a comma before each coordinating conjunction to indicate 2 sentences are being connected.
