Emily Harrington and **Elvin Schlanger**, both accomplished flutists and life partners, share a deep musical connection that shines in every performance. Their collaboration combines years of experience as performers and educators, resulting in a sound that is both expressive and seamlessly unified.

Elvin Schlanger is a tenured member of the Las Vegas Philharmonic and was recently appointed Principal Flute of the Dayton Philharmonic Orchestra. He has also performed with the Los Angeles Philharmonic and studied at California State University, Long Beach, Yale University, and the Colburn School.

Emily Harrington is an active freelancer, performing in solo, chamber, and orchestral settings. Her orchestral experience includes performances with the Modesto Symphony and Juneau Symphony. She studied at California State University, Long Beach, and the University of Southern California, and is the founder of *Harrington Flute Studio*, where she teaches and mentors aspiring flutists with a focus on artistry and musical growth.

Together as *Duo Amandi*, Emily and Elvin present programs spanning Baroque masterworks to contemporary repertoire, offering audiences performances that celebrate the versatility, expressiveness, and joy of the flute.

Phillip Matsuura maintains an active career as a collaborative pianist and ensemble musician. He has concertized with principals of The Metropolitan Opera Orchestra, the Los Angeles Philharmonic, and other major orchestras. As a freelance orchestral keyboardist, he has performed with the Los Angeles Philharmonic and the San Diego Symphony, and holds degrees from the University of Southern California, Northwestern University and Oberlin Conservatory.
