

WHAT IS THE ROLE OF THE DRC?

Disability Resource Center (DRC) at Palomar College is committed to removing barriers to access for students with documented disabilities. The DRC works with faculty and staff collaboratively to ensure that students with disabilities can participate fully in College programs and activities to reach their educational and vocational goals.

WHAT ARE THE STEPS TO ENROLL IN THE DRC?

1. Complete a one page DRC application
2. Obtain disability verification from the appropriate licensed professional.
3. E-mail completed documents
4. Once all documents have been delivered and reviewed/approved, Front Office staff will contact you for an intake appointment with a DRC counselor.

WHAT SERVICES ARE OFFERED TO STUDENTS?

- Academic and personal counseling
- Test accommodations in a fully equipped Testing Center
- Note-taking assistance
- Learning Disability Assessment
- Deaf and Hard of Hearing Services
 - Sign Language Interpreting, Real-Time Captioning, and an Assistive Listening Device loan program
- Access Technology Center
 - Students receive training in the use of assistive technology including Echo SmartPen notetaking technology, text to speech software, screen magnification, braille displays, and more.
- Alternate Media
 - The conversion of textbooks and class materials to audio, Braille, and large print.
- Specialized Courses and Instruction (noncredit and credit)
