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### **1. Apply to Palomar College**

### **2. Activate & Check Your Palomar Student Email**

Activate your student email and check your email frequently for important updates.



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### **3. Complete the FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application**

Submit your FAFSA or Dream Act application, and include Palomar College School Code: 001260. You must have an official application on file with the college.



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### **4. Attend the New Student Orientation**

Orientation is mandatory for all new Palomar College students.



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### **5. Submit Your Palomar Promise Application**

Visit MyPalomar (student portal) to submit your Promise application. Applications will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis pending availability of program funds.



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### **6. View Your Promise Checklist**

Log on to MyPalomar to view your Promise status and eligibility checklist



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### **7. Counseling**

Schedule a counseling appointment to develop your educational plan. Group advising sessions will be available in the spring. Call the Promise Office at 760-744-1150, ext. 3931 or the Counseling Department at (760) 891-7511 to schedule an appointment.



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### **8. Register for Classes**

Enroll full-time on your priority registration date. Students who have a disability which interferes with taking a full course load may be eligible for accommodations, including a waiver of the 12 unit requirement, through the Disability Resource Center (DRC).
