## 1. Apply to Palomar College

## 3. Apply for Financial Aid

Submit your FAFSA or Dream Act application, and include Palomar College School Code: 001260. You must have an official application on file with the college. Errors in filing out the FAFSA/CADAA can result in processing delays.

### 7. Develop an Education Plan

Starting spring semester, schedule an appointment with a counselor to help you select your fall classes.
