1. Apply to Palomar College

Apply online to Palomar College at www.palomar.edu/apply.

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2. Activate & Check Your Palomar Student Email

Activate your student email and check your email frequently for important updates. The Promise Office will only communicate with you through your Palomar email address.

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3. Apply for Financial Aid

Submit your FAFSA or Dream Act application, and include Palomar College School Code: 001260. You must have an official application on file with the college. Errors in filling out the FAFSA/CADAA can result in processing delays.

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4. Submit Your Palomar Promise Application

Visit MyPalomar student portal (click on the Financials tab) to submit your Promise application. Applications are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis pending availability of program funds.

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5. View Your Promise Checklist

Log into MyPalomar to view your Promise application status and eligibility checklist.

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6. Complete the New Student Orientation

Online orientation is mandatory for new Palomar College students.

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7. Develop an Education Plan

Schedule an appointment with a counselor to help you select your fall classes. Contact the Promise Office at (760) 744-1150 ext. 3931 or call the Counseling Department at (760) 891-7511 to schedule an appointment. An education plan is an important and necessary step to prepare for fall registration.

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8. Register for Classes

Enroll full-time on your priority registration date. Students who have a disability which interferes with taking a full course load may be eligible for accommodations, including a waiver of the 12 unit requirement, through the Disability Resource Center (DRC). Contact the DRC for more information.
