I. CALL TO ORDER/INTRODUCTION

DISCUSSION ITEM(S)- OLD BUSINESS

DISCUSSION ITEM(S) - NEW BUSINESS

1. CHIEF MOORE: currently have four full-time officers for the hiring poll. Has been able to process a 9/60-retiree working part time position. An off-site monitor for our 24-hour Operation Fire Alarm system has been implanted since the beginning of the winter break. March is Women's History Month- attending Women in Blue event and on March 14th Women in Law Enforcement Panel at the LRC-438 1000-1130 hours. Active shooter training done on January with San Diego Sheriffs and SWAT.
2. WILLIAM "SKIP" CLARK: asks how many CSOs are currently in the department.
3. CHIEF MOORE: 10 CSOs, no full time.
4. WILLIAM "SKIP" CLARK: goal is to increase awareness of concerning behaviors-Threat Assessment. Invited Special Agent Lauritz Austensen (Department of Homeland Security) to provide further information regarding this issue.
5. SPECIAL AGENT AUSTENSEN: currently working on two projects- Campus Sentinel-misused of Visas and Campus Security Program FBI-identify indicators of counter terrorism. The program has been expanded to K-12 as concerning behaviors start to manifest at a young age. This program helps to educate custodial staff, educators, anyone that runs into anyone with a concerning behavioral. LECC- San Diego Law Enforcement Coordinator Center- report suspicious email threads/behavior, keeps school safe by reporting potential threats. Program was set up after 9/11 to share potential threat information around the country.
6. WILLIAM "SKIP" CLARK: shared information regarding the Red Folder Palomar College has shared with employees. A digital copy will be emailed to all.
7. CHIEF MOORE: will contact the Behavioral Health committee to request more information regarding the Red Folder.
