DISCUSSION ITEM(S) - NEW BUSINESS

1. CHIEF MOORE: Reports on the following:
 - A) overview on the hiring process for police officers. Expand coverage to all colleges by August 2024.
 - B) Update on fence at the Escondido Campus-
 - C) OSHA mandate-July 1, 2024-Work Place Violence Prevention, will have a further discussion about this within the next week (defining certain types of threats, developing awareness). Visibility of every month safety and security.
2. CHIEF MOORE: Cameras have been installed at the SU building (2 cameras). The PAC building will be the next assigned area to place cameras. The cameras are for security purposes.
3. THOMAS DAILY: Notifies that the theater accepts cash.
4. CHIEF MOORE: LRC and PAC building will continue to request cameras for those particular places since those are the most visited by students.
5. YVETTE MAYNARD: asks if places that accept cash are being considered for placing cameras around.

8. CHIEF MOORE: Escondido fence is making progress. Body worn cameras are being worked on with Sgt. Montes looking into quotes.

10. CHIEF MOORE: 80% of departments. Mira Costa College, Southwestern College, Cal State University San Marcos, San Diego City College are some of the colleges that already have body worn cameras. Camera policy is on the website.
