I. CALL TO ORDER/INTRODUCTION

3. Chief Moore notifies that the Blue Phones are being worked on.
4. Safety and Security issues brought by ASG President Christopher Garcia Mendez at the Board meeting regarding pedestrians walking through lots 1 & 2. Chief Moore and Chris Miller have been in contact regarding this issue and will proceed on working to secure safety for all pedestrians.

DISCUSSION ITEM(S) - NEW BUSINESS

1. CHIEF MOORE: October visited Interfaith Services in Escondido to get a better understanding of services given and how the department can assist this program. Student Life and Leadership have connected to Interfaith Services Attended DRC disable student prospective. Mentions that the hour talks are very informative. Attended a two-day command school at the Los Angeles Museum of Tolerance. Completed presentations at ESL via Zoom. Five officers were given the opportunity to be invited to meet the President of the United States at Mira Costa College. A Coffee with a Cop was done with LGBTQ+ to enhance trust with them back in November. Shared experience and communicated concerns. The department attended the Veterans service on campus. The other half of our officers were able to tour One Safe Place, to get a better understanding of the services that are provided to those in need. Chief Moore is collaborating with the president to provide educational classes. Working on Mental Health. Two full time dispatcher position have been sent to the board.
2. THOMAS DAILY: mentioned that HR is looking at 40 plus hiring committee and encourages if anyone would like to be a compliance officer, HR department is looking for them.
3. THOMAS DAILY: opinions on whether to have a face to face meet for spring semester.
4. LISA CASAS: Teams works better for those that are not on the main campus.
5. THOMAS DAILY: meet both, remotely and in person.
6. CHIEF MOORE: We can do both virtual and in person at PD-128.
7. THOMAS DAILY: hostess needs to monitor de computer and make sure that no one gets missed.
8. LISA CASAS: Thanks officer Forest for participating at her class. Appreciates having a female officer representing the department.
9. CHIEF MOORE: department just hired two more female CSOs.
10. WILLIAM "SKIP" CLARK: shares that he was part of a great meeting regarding the future for the Escondido campus (expanding day care). Reports that no transient problems have occurred.
11. LISA CASAS: the redo of landscape has helped transients relocate.
12. GI WILSON: shares he has been working with the operational specialists psychologist of Los Angeles Sheriff's Department regarding the officer that were injured during their training. The Metropolitan Community College in Omaha, Nebraska is interested in setting up a Threat Assessment team. He will forward the information to Chief Moore. Offers training for those interested on Threat Assessment Reporting.
13. CRAIG CHAMBERLIN: very interested on the training and requests more information.
14. MICHELLE FIFIELD: training open for everyone?

15. GI WILSON: yes. Will work with Chief Moore to set up trainings and with Mr. Chamberlin to work with faculty.
