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Safety & Security Talking Points for EH&S

Month of February

Campus Emergency Preparedness:

1. On Monday, September 24th, 2018, Palomar Community College District conducted two district-wide Emergency Lockdown Preparedness Drills.
 - Drill locations included the San Marcos campus, Escondido Education Center, Rancho Bernardo South Education Center, Fallbrook North Education Center, 3C Media, and Santar Place.
 - The Public Affairs Office sent out a brief survey to the campus community for feedback regarding the lockdown drill.
 - Results from the lockdown drill survey is still pending.
2. On Thursday, October 18th, 2018, Palomar Community College District conducted two district-wide Earthquake Drills.
3. On Friday, November 16th, 2018 Palomar Community College District conducted an evacuation drill of the MD-Building.

Stormwater:

January 28th, 2019 Annual (MS4) Storm Water Inspection San Marcos Campus

1. The EH&S Department and the county inspector conducted an inspection to ensure that Palomar's San Marcos Campus is in compliance with our Storm Water Management Plan and the local regulatory requirements.

Results from the inspections determined that the following issues existed:

Storage of items above dumpsters:

- ✓ The following items: appliances, metal cabinets, concrete debris, asphalt debris, broken tables, junk items, "trash", etc. must not be stored on the ground.
- ✓ All items need to be properly disposed of or stored entirely on pallets.
- ✓ Cardboard bin is not promptly picked up/ called in when full. There is a large pile of soaked cardboard.

Washing/ rinsing of carts:

- ✓ Parking-lot cart is hosed down and run off is not contained.

Other:

Degraded plastic tarps on the construction site shown in yellow hue need to be cleaned up.

Notes: Reoccurring suggestion during inspections to build some type of shelter above dumpsters or tarp like cover to insure water does not enter trash.







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
