


More on Evacuations

- Sweep every room to make sure that everyone has been evacuated
- Direct faculty, staff & students to evacuation routes
- Direct occupants to the appropriate Emergency Assembly Point(s) (EAPs)
- Notify Campus Police of any personnel trapped or whose location is unknown
- Be prepared to shut off valves for piped gases & compressed gas cylinders


