

SAFETY & SECURITY COMMITTEE MINUTES

April 2, 2008

A meeting of the Safety & Security Committee was held on *Wednesday, April 2, 2008, at* 2:00 p.m., in RS-5.

Call to Order

Kelley Hudson-MacIsaac called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m.

Kelley moved to suspend the agenda and approve the meeting minutes at a later time due to the absence of a quorum.

B. <u>Discussion/Information Items</u>

1. Workers Comp

Kelley reported on Lucy's behalf that during the month of March 2008, five claims were processed; one of which was a fall on some gravel outside of the Library and one involved a serious incident at the Wood Shop in the T-Building in which 9-1-1 was called while Campus Police and the Instructional Dean were present. Environmental Health & Safety and Health Services were neither called nor notified and as of today's date both departments are still waiting on a report involving this incident. Kelley will coordinate with the Director of Human Resources – Debbie Allen on the correct process involving these types of incidents.

4. Health Services – Jayne Conway

Jayne discussed the February 2008 Emergency Response and Advanced First Aid Summary Reports.

Highlights for the month of March 2008 included:

- AED reprogramming
- Student In Crisis Working Group is currently working on "legal issues" involving this process.

 Health Services is working with Tom Plotts, Chief of Police, to conduct a safety seminar at the next plenary session in fall of 2008.

5. **ASG**

Paul reported the Associated Student Government recently made a trip to Washington D.C. during spring break.

Paul reported that there was a healthy discussion at SPC regarding the smoking policy. ASG will bring the policy and procedures to the next meeting of SPC on April 15, 2008. Faculty and Classified Staff are against the policy as they feel it is part of their working conditions during their employment at the College.

6. Environmental Health & Safety

Kelley reported that John Emerson has been officially hired as her department's new Facilities & Environmental Technician.

John reported on the following activity for March 2008:

- John oversaw one (1) indoor air quality evaluation and asbestos removal

a. **Emergency Response Plan Working Group**

Kelley shared that she and Tom Plotts recently met with the Faculty Senate to discuss the Emergency Response Plan including locksets and security cameras.

1. Yellow Caution Marks around Doorways

Mike reported that many of the yellow caution markings around exterior campus doorways have faded. Before assigning the District maintenance painters to refresh these areas, Mike wanted to know if yellow caution markings are needed on interior doorways (this would not include carpeted areas).

Mike directed each member to take this request back to their constituents for their feedback/comments and bring back to our next meeting on Wednesday, May 7, 2008.

- b. Mike reported that the placing of the modular buildings in Parking Lot 2 will occur in summer of 2008 with the vending machines be located between the DOME and the O-Building.

Snack Shack Ramp

Kelley indicated that she will look into this issue with the Escondido Center Educational Master Plan.

4. Aramark requesting Security Cameras at Escondido Center

Theo reported that she has been approached by Diane Lach, Director of Food Services for Aramark, to install security cameras at the Snack area at the Escondido Center to deter theft at lunchtime.
