### 6. Environmental Health & Safety Office-Derrick Johnson

Derrick reported on the following information:

- a) There will be one more First Aid CPR/AED training class before the end of the year on December 12<sup>th</sup>. The classes have been very successful. Approximately 75 people will have completed the training by the end of the year and another class will be planned in January.
- b) EH&S had a third party vendor come out to investigate revising our chemical hygiene plan. Derrick sent a draft to the Deans to distribute, review and add comments. We hope to implement this modification mid-February.
- c) We have two new part time employees: Yolande Berg who will be helping with the emergency response training, emergency preparedness programs, and OSHA compliance, and Samantha West, who will be working with haz-mat, safety and fire extinguisher inspections.

### E. Discussion/Other Items

## I. <u>Improper cigarette disposal</u>:

Derrick reported that there were some recent smoking incidents that caused fires on campus. He forwarded information to President Deegan. Chris reported it to FASPC. From there it should go to SPC. Policies and Procedures committee is polling members regarding their thoughts on smoking. Classified staff will poll their members. Derrick had a prior proposal of either a designated area or no smoking at all. We are looking into municipal code versus penal code in terms of enforcement.

# 2. Safety and Security Infrastructure:

Chris spoke of prioritizing projects: We are getting rid of the old blue phones and switching to talk-aphone units. That project is funded and is going out for bid for completion prior to June 2015. In the American Sign Language (ASL) department: message scrolling boards will be installed also. Additional parking lot security cameras as a pilot project was completed a few years ago in lots 9, 12, 3, 5. We are identifying new areas to install additional cameras. We are looking into areas near the student union, main sidewalk, and lot 1. Chris mentioned the following upcoming safety and security plans:

- o Participating in the Great American Shakeout for October, 2015.
- Installing gates at the entrances of the campus.
- Blackboard connect upgrade mobile command post.

## 3. Building Concern:

Chris Miller spoke about an incident where an individual was working on the roof of a building and a safety concern was reported to facilities as to whether he was an employee. Chris suggested identifying staff with vests with Palomar College name and department on the back of it. He also discussed the possibility of wearing a uniform, which would have to be approved by the CCE/AFF.

### F. Safety Concerns

- 1. Marilee Nebelsick-Tagg mentioned fire extinguisher boxes are white and are difficult to see.
- 2. Carl mentioned that San Marcos Fire has an Mobile Emergency Operations Center (MEOP) at station 4 if anyone is interested in looking at it to get ideas for our EOC.
