Enrollment (Registration) Qualifying for Enrollment

Palomar College has a fully automated registration system. Students may apply and enroll online. To be eligible to enroll, students must have a current application on file. Returning students who have missed one semester must re-apply via eServices in order to receive an enrollment appointment. Continuing students who were enrolled in fall, new students, and returning students who submit an application for summer by April 9 will receive a priority online registration appointment. After April 9, apply or reapply online for access to registration during the open enrollment period.

Palomar ID and Password

Once your application is processed, you will be issued a unique Palomar ID number. To enroll, you will use your Palomar ID number and a password. Your password can be up to 15 characters long. Note: If you forget your Palomar ID and or password, click on the link, ID/Password Help located below the password box on the sign in page. Follow the online instructions to retrieve your ID and set a new password. For your added protection, you will be asked to choose a challenge question and provide a response. If you forget the response, visit Admissions with a picture ID to have your challenge question reset.

Enrollment Appointment

All class enrollments are processed online in eServices using Student Center. Don't worry if you miss your online appointment, you may enroll any time after your scheduled appointment. Repeating a Course

Recent updates to Title 5 regulations have changed the number of allowable course repeats (T5, 55040-55046). Effective January 1, 2013, the maximum number of enrollments, including withdrawals (W's), for regular courses will be limited to **three**. All enrollments, including W grades, prior to January 2013 will be included in the count.

A student who receives a satisfactory grade (A, B, C, P, CR) in a credit course cannot enroll again in that course except in very limited circumstances. A student who receives an unsatisfactory grade (D, F, FW, NP, NC) or withdrawal (W) on the initial enrollment is permitted to enroll again in the course. When repeating courses due to withdrawal or unsatisfactory grades, students are limited to the original enrollment plus two subsequent enrollments.

Only three types of courses are repeatable:

- Where repetition is necessary to meet the major requirements of CSU or UC for completion of a bachelor's degree
- Intercollegiate athletic courses (includes related conditioning courses)
- Intercollegiate academic or vocational competition

Please consult the college catalog for more specific information on the repetition of courses.

The Enrollment Priority System

Recent updates to legislation governing the California Community Colleges have resulted in a new enrollment priority system. These changes are designed to reward students for behavior that will help them succeed in their studies and complete their certificate, degree, or transfer program in a timely manner. Students will be assigned registration appointments in the following priority scheme:

Group 1. Disability Resource Center (DRC), EOP&S, foster youth, CalWORKS, eligible veterans, and active duty military personnel who submit an application and complete assessment, orientation and development of an education plan prior to the deadline date.

Appointments are assigned by descending unit order starting at 90 earned units completed at Palomar College.

Group 2. Students in their last term of attendance prior to graduation or transfer. Appointments are assigned by descending order for all earned units completed at Palomar College.

Group 3. New, returning, transfer, and continuing students who complete orientation, assessment and development of an education plan in the immediate period of time prior to the deadline date, usually the first day of class for the preceding full academic term. Appointments are assigned by descending unit order starting at 90 earned units completed at Palomar College.

Group 4. Student participating in approved special programs. Appointments are assigned by descending unit order starting at 90 earned units completed at Palomar College.

Group 5. Continuing students who are actively registered at census the prior semester or actively registered in a course as of the deadline date. Appointments are assigned by descending unit order starting at 90 earned units completed at Palomar College.

Group 6. New, returning, or transfer students who are not in Group 3. Appointments are assigned by descending unit order starting at 90 earned units completed at Palomar College.

Group 7. Returning or continuing students with 90 or more earned units completed at Palomar College and/or students who have been on Academic or Progress Probation for two or more consecutive terms. Appointments are assigned by ascending unit order for all earned units completed at Palomar College.

Group 8. Non-high school graduates age 16 to 18. Students less than 16 years of age require permission of the instructor to enroll in classes.

ADDING A COURSE

To add courses to your schedule, use the Add/Drop Classes link from your Student Center. You must obtain a permission number from the faculty member after the last day to add without a permission number date (referenced above), or if you are waitlisted or the class is closed.

DROPPING A COURSE

To drop a class, select the **Add/Drop Classes** link in Student Center. All students are expected to attend classes. Failure to attend class can result in an F or FW grade, unless the student processes a drop before the W deadline.

PASS/NO PASS

Complete the P/NP grading form and return it to the Admissions Office within the first 30 percent of the course. **No faculty signature needed.** However, students are advised that four-year schools may limit the number of P units acceptable for transfer. Major preparatory classes should never be taken on a P/NP basis. ENG 100, 202 and 203 may not be taken as P/NP. In most cases, courses numbered below 100 are ideally suited for the P/NP option. Please see a counselor to find out how this option may impact your educational goals. The change of grading status is not reversible.

AUDITING A COURSE

Complete an application for audit, obtain signatures of the faculty member, department chair, and Dean, and return form to the Admissions Office or an Education Center. Audit enrollments are not allowed before the first class meeting. Students who enroll for credit have priority over auditors, and **not all classes are available for auditing.** If changing from credit to audit status after the refund deadline, no enrollment fees will be refunded and the \$15 per unit audit fee will be charged in addition to the enrollment fees. The change from credit to audit status is not reversible. There is no deadline for original registration under audit status.

WAIT LISTS

Before the beginning of the semester, if a class is closed, you may place your name on a wait list (if available). If a seat becomes available, you will be automatically added and your student account will be charged with the enrollment fees. Please check your schedule online frequently to confirm your status. PERMISSION NUMBERS

- Are numbers that are assigned to students by faculty to authorize enrollment in a class that is closed.
- Are different from class numbers.
- EXPIRE after the above add deadline dates

DO NOT DELAY in adding your class with your permission number. After the add deadline, you will not be allowed to add.

GRADES & SCHEDULES

Spring 2018 grades will be available beginning five business days after the last date of the course. You may access your semester grades and student schedules online using Student eServices at www.palomar.edu. You may use a computer in the Admissions lobby, Career Center, or Library to access the Palomar College home page. Look for the eServices link.

General Matriculation Procedures

Matriculation Rights and Responsibilities:

Matriculation is a process which assists you in choosing, planning, and achieving your educational and career goals. It is Palomar's way of supporting your right to succeed in college. Matriculation is a partnership between you and Palomar.

Palomar College agrees to:

- Evaluate your English, ESL, math and reading skills
- Help you register for appropriate classes
- Provide you with an orientation and information on services available, and possible majors and/or careers
- Provide access to counselors and instruction

You agree to:

- Decide upon your major and goal
- Participate in orientation and assessment
- Meet with a counselor to develop an educational plan by the time you have completed 15 units
- Attend and complete courses to make the best use of the time you spend at Palomar
- Prior to registration, all non-exempt students must complete the following steps that apply: Fill out an application for admission online at **www.palomar.edu**
- Send in all transcripts or previous assessment scores and request an evaluation for equivalency
- Sign up for and attend an assessment and orientation session at the Assessment Center, in SU-1.

New, returning, or transfer students who may be exempted from the matriculation process are students who:

- Already have an associate's degree or higher
- Are attending Palomar for personal enrichment
- Are enrolled only in non-credit courses
- Are taking classes only to upgrade job skills
- Are enrolled in apprenticeship or other special vocational education programs
- Are concurrently enrolled in another college or university

Exempt students are not required to participate in the matriculation process but are encouraged to see a counselor at any time.

The college may suspend or terminate services to any student who fails to fulfill his/her responsibilities. However, the college may never suspend or terminate any service for which a student is otherwise entitled under any other provision of law. In addition, students may challenge any matriculation requirement or regulation using the petition process.

Enrollment restrictions:

Many courses and education programs of study have enrollment conditions such as prerequisites, corequisites or advisories on recommended preparation. These faculty-approved conditions are considered necessary and appropriate to ensure that you are adequately prepared to succeed in the course or education program. It is your responsibility to meet any and all enrollment conditions.

Advisory on Recommended Preparation:

Recommended preparation is a condition of enrollment that you are advised, but not required, to meet before or in conjunction with enrollment in a course or education program. If you believe that you have satisfied the advisory by means other than the stated advisory, please consult with the appropriate department to determine your readiness to enroll in the course or educational program.

Other Limits on Enrollment:

Enrollment in certain courses or educational programs of study may require tryouts, auditions or may be limited by health and safety considerations, facility limitations, faculty workload, the availability of qualified instructors, funding limitations or legal requirements imposed by statutes, regulations or contracts. All such limitations are in conformity with the provisions of Title 5, Section 58106, California Community College Board of Governors.

Prerequisites:

A prerequisite is a condition of enrollment that you are required to meet in order to demonstrate current readiness in a course or education program. You may be required to show proof of meeting the prerequisite. Failure to meet the stated prerequisite may result in being administratively dropped from the course.

Corequisites:

A corequisite is a condition of enrollment consisting of a course that you are required to simultaneously take in order to enroll in another course. Failure to enroll in the stated corequisite will result in being administratively dropped from the course.

You may not be permitted to enroll in a class for which you cannot demonstrate that you have met the prerequisite or are enrolled in the corequisite. If it is determined after a course begins that you have not met the prerequisite, you may be dropped from the course.

If you are currently enrolled in a prerequisite course at Palomar College, you will be permitted to enroll in the next level course on the assumption that you will pass the prerequisite course with a C or better. If you do not successfully pass the course (receive a grade of D, F, FW, NC, I, or W) you will be dropped from the next level class.

Challenging a Prerequisite:

You have the right to challenge any prerequisite.

A prerequisite or corequisite challenge requires written documentation, explanation of alternative course work, background, abilities, or other evidence showing adequate preparation for the target course. A Prerequisite or Corequisite Challenge Petition can be obtained from the Admissions Office, in the Counseling Center, or at a College Center office. Reasons for seeking a Prerequisite and Corequisite Challenge Petition may include one or more of the following:

- (1) A prerequisite or corequisite has not been made reasonably available.
- (2) A prerequisite or corequisite has not been established in accordance with the District's process for establishing prerequisites and corequisite.
- (3) A student can provide evidence of having the knowledge or ability needed to succeed in the course despite not meeting the prerequisite or corequisite.
- (4) A student may challenge other limitations on enrollment.
- (5) A student may challenge a prerequisite or corequisite established to protect the health and safety of himself, herself, and/or others.
- (6) A prerequisite, corequisite or limitation on enrollment is discriminatory or applied in a discriminatory manner.
- (7) A prerequisite or corequisite is in violation of Title 5.



The English, Reading and Math placement results are based on the information you provided on the Palomar College application for admission. Results can be viewed on the eServices student portal, at the bottom right corner of the Student Center page in the Assessment/Placement Eligibility box.

The Assessment Office may also consider the following documentation for English, Reading and Math placement:

- completed English and/or Math courses at other colleges
- a score of 3 or higher on AP English and/or Math tests
- other college placement test results if taken within the last two years
- test results from SAT, ACT, ELM, and/or EPT taken within the last two years

Assessment

Identifies a student's present level of skills in English, reading and math.

Advisement

Students receive their results and are made aware of the level of English, reading and math for which they may register.

Orientation

The orientation gives an overview of instructional programs and support services. Certificate, degree and transfer requirements are discussed to assist the student with registration. This process, along with assessment and advisement takes approximately three hours.

Students Who Have Been Enrolled At Other Colleges

Students who have completed assessment at another college (within the past two years) will need to bring in or FAX test scores to our Student Access/Assessment Center 760-591-0482. We will make the student eligible for the same level classes at Palomar.

If you have completed coursework in English and/or math at another college, we will need to see a copy of your grade report or transcript. We accept unofficial copies. Students may bring it in or FAX it to us. Completed coursework does not expire.



Palomar College CSU GE Advising Guide Spring 2018

The California State University (CSU) General Education-Breadth pattern is one option that allows California Community College transfer students to fulfill the lower-division general education requirements of any California State University campus. The pattern includes 39 lower-division semester units with a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA required, which may be certified by California Community Colleges. Partial certification may be granted by Area (A, B, C, D, or E). Full certification may be granted if all areas and units are completed. Courses may only be certified in one area and must be on the list at the time it was completed. Please see a counselor for specific information regarding major preparation.

Students must petition for certification in the Evaluations Office located in SSC-40. The petition deadline dates are as follows:

B1. Physical Science

Student Enrollment Fee*

\$46 per unit - Enrollment fee for all students. This fee is subject to change. If the enrollment fee is increased by state law after registration has begun, you will be required to pay the increase for all classes on your schedule at that time.

Student Center Fee

A student center fee will be assessed to each student attending classes at the San Marcos campus in the amount of \$1 per credit unit, not to exceed \$10 per academic year (Summer through Spring). No refunds or waivers will be made after the refund deadline. Funds generated from this fee will be used to finance, construct, enlarge, remodel, refurbish and operate a student center, also known as a Student Union. Students who are recipients of benefits under the CalWORKS (known as TANF), SSI, SSP and the General Assistance Program are exempt from this fee. Note: This is determined by the student's eligibility for a BOGW A enrollment fee waiver. All other BOGW status students are required to pay the Student Center Fee.

Student Representation Fee

A \$1 fee per semester is collected to provide funds to support student leaders who state positions and viewpoints before city, county and district governments, and before state and federal agencies and offices.

Palomar Student Activity Card

All students should purchase a Palomar Student Activity Card each semester. This card will serve as a picture identification card and is imprinted with your student identification number which is required for all transactions with Palomar (registrations, payments, lab usage, etc.) Revenue from sales of the Activity Card is used to provide entertainment, extra and co-curricular events, inter-cultural celebrations, purchase equipment and

supplies and to provide support for a wide range of student activities on campus.

There are many benefits of the Activity Card including discounts at the college bookstore, periodic free food and beverages at student activities, free and discounted special events on campus (athletic and performing arts events), discounted NCTD bus passes, access to the Student Union Computer Lab (SU-28), discounted offerings from local merchants, free lock and locker usage on campus, free scantrons and photocopying, and much more. The benefits are listed on the Student Affairs web page.

The Student Activity Card is \$15 per semester. The fee can be paid on-line through Student eServices or the Cashier's Office. After registering and the fee has been paid, visit the Student Activities Office, SU-202, to have your picture taken and pick up your card. This fee is nonrefundable.

Student Health Fee (AP 5030)

A state-mandated student health fee is charged for operation of the Health Centers as authorized in Education Code 76355. A semester fee of \$19 will be charged to all part-time and full-time students enrolled in credit and non-credit classes offered through Palomar College, except the following:

- Students taking only apprenticeship classes
- Students who depend exclusively on prayer for healing in accordance with the teachings of a bona fide religious sect, denomination or organization. Fee Payment and Drop Procedures

A final drop for non-payment of fees will occur in the week preceding the start of classes. Students who are not automatically dropped will be responsible for dropping their own courses before the refund deadline. Failure to make payments of any amounts owed to the College when they become due, is considered sufficient cause to withhold future enrollment, grades, transcripts, diplomas, certificates and/or degrees or any other College service.

Payments are accepted at the San Marcos and Escondido location. Cash payments are made at your own risk. Students may pay fees online in eServices using VISA, Mastercard, AMEX or Discover.

Fee Waivers

Enrollment Fee Waiver

Students from private or public elementary or secondary schools who are admitted to Palomar College as special part-time students for credit classes during regular semester or summer session are exempt from paying the enrollment fee. Home schooled minors also may enroll with permission from their local school district. Attendance must be authorized by a letter of permission from the school. Students under 16 years of age must obtain permission from the Palomar instructor prior to registration.

Board of Governors Enrollment Fee Waiver (BOGW)

The Board of Governors Enrollment Fee Waiver (BOGW) will waive the enrollment fee for eligible California resident students. Complete the online BOGW application in your eServices Student Center. Go to www.palomar.edu and click on eServices. Sign in and click on Apply for BOGW fee waiver in the My Finances and Financial Aid section. You can also verify your eligibility by clicking on View Financial Aid or email finaid@palomar.edu from your Palomar student email account.

BOG Fee Waiver Changes, Effective Fall 2016

Once you've qualified for the BOG Fee Waiver, it is important to ensure that you are meeting the academic and progress standards in order to avoid losing the BOG Fee Waiver.

Academic - Maintain a GPA of 2.0 or higher

If your cumulative GPA falls below 2.0 for two (2) consecutive primary terms (fall and spring semesters are primary terms at Palomar) you will lose your BOG Fee Waiver eligibility.

Progress - Complete more than 50% of your coursework

If the cumulative number of courses you successfully complete is not more than 50% in two (2) consecutive primary terms (fall and spring semesters are primary terms at Palomar) you will lose your BOG Fee Waiver eligibility.

Combination of Academic and Progress Standards

Any combination of two consecutive terms of cumulative GPA below 2.0 and/or cumulative course completion is not more than 50% may result in loss of BOG Fee Waiver eligibility.

You will be notified within 30 days of the end of each term if you are being placed on either Academic (GPA) and/or Progress (Course Completion) probation. Your notification will include the information that a second term of probation will result in loss of BOG Fee Waiver eligibility. After the second consecutive term of probation, you may lose eligibility for the BOG Fee Waiver at your next registration opportunity.

Student Representative Fee Waiver

A student may, for religious, political, financial and or moral reasons choose not to pay the Student Representation Fee noted in this section. Students must submit a request for waiver of this fee, in writing, before the Refund/Waiver Deadline. See the online Student Rep Fee Waiver Request form in the eServices Student Center.

Enrollment Fee Refund/Waiver Policy

Semester-length classes must be formally dropped by the Refund/Waiver Deadline to qualify for a refund or waiver. No refunds or waivers will be granted for drops after the refund deadline, unless the class is canceled by the College or if a verified processing error by the College occurred. There is no prorated refund schedule. The refund deadline for other sessions is the 13th day after the start day of the class.

Not attending classes does not warrant a refund or waiver of fees. It is the student's responsibility to drop classes by the refund/waiver deadline or incur the fees.

Refunds will be processed after the Refund/Waiver deadline and can take up to four weeks from the deadline date for the refund process to complete.

If payment was made by credit card, debit card, or gift card*, the refund will be credited back to the card used. If payment was made by cash or check, the refund check will be mailed to the student's address of record. Refunds cannot be carried forward for credit to the next semester's registration. Refunds are processed after all fees and obligations owed to the College are met. Refunds of \$1.00 or less will not be processed unless requested at the Cashier's Office. Refunds will not be issued one year after the end of the semester.


Any student wishing to earn an A.A. degree must complete English 100 with a grade of 'C' or better. The student must participate in the English placement process before enrolling in any English or English as a Second Language composition class except ENG 10 and 150. The eligibility will indicate whether the student may enroll in ENG 50 or ENG 100. Students whose first language is not English may find, however, that ESL instruction meets their needs better than immediate enrollment in ENG 10 or 50. Such students may take one or more ESL classes (ESL 101, 102, 103) instead; then by again participating in the English placement process, they may qualify for ENG 50 or ENG 100. Non-resident international students may be required to take one or more classes of English as a Second Language. Students should sign up for English assessment as soon as possible because some students may take three or more semesters to finish the competence requirements in English. Contact the Assessment Center for the English assessment schedule, ext. 2476. Students interested in a Directed Studies class should contact the Department.







DISTANCE EDUCATION AT PALOMAR COLLEGE INCLUDES:

Online (Internet) – (may require some meetings on campus) and Video Classes – (require some meetings on campus). Distance Education is an interactive instructional experience in which the learner and the instructor are in separate physical locations for the majority of the instructional activities. The various technologies used for delivery of instruction may include some combination of print, voice, video, and data delivered via the Internet or cable TV. Distance education classes are equivalent to traditional lecture-based classes with no distinction made on transcripts to indicate the class was taken via distance education.

Distance Education Courses May Be An Attractive Option For Students:

- whose work or family commitments do not allow them to attend classes on campus;
- who cannot commute to campus to take face-to-face courses;
- who are taking other classes on campus but wish to explore the flexibility that distance/online education may provide.

Most **online** and **video** classes at Palomar College use the Blackboard Learning System® or Canvas. Both are web-based course management systems. They are easy-to-use, menu-driven applications. Students must be enrolled in a class to access its Blackboard or Canvas websites. Instructors may use a combination of various delivery methods and sites for their courses that may or may not include Blackboard or Canvas.

Special Admission for Accelerated Students

To be considered for admission, minors must have completed the ninth grade or reached the age of 16, and have permission of the local school district. Home-schooled minors may enroll with permission of the local school district. Minors, under 16 years of age, with permission from a public or private school, and the Palomar College instructor, may enroll only in courses specified by the local school district or private school. Otherwise, minors under 16 years of age are limited to enrolling in special classes devoted to children, such as child development lab classes or youth orchestra. Credit earned is college credit and may also be used as high school credit with consent of the high school. See the Admissions Office for details. Minor children enrolled in classes and programs must adhere to the Student Code of Conduct.

Minor Children

It is the expectation of Palomar College that minor children of currently enrolled students will be under the constant supervision of parents or guardians (notwithstanding those minor children enrolled in Palomar College classes and programs) and that said parents or guardians are responsible for assuring appropriate behavior of minor children. Parents or guardians will be held responsible when the behavior of minor children constitutes a violation of the Palomar College Code of Conduct and these parents or guardians may be directed to remove the minor children from District facilities (classrooms, libraries, food services, operations, athletic events, public areas, etc.) should violations occur.

Student Code of Conduct

Student conduct must conform to District and College rules and regulations. Student Discipline Procedures (AP5520) provide a prompt and equitable means to address violations of the Standards of Student Conduct, which guarantees to the student or students involved the due process rights guaranteed to them by the California and United States Constitutions.

If a Student Code of Conduct violation occurs while a student is enrolled at Palomar College, he or she may be disciplined. The Standards of Conduct categories of behavior are not intended to be an exhaustive list, but are examples of causes

and are good and sufficient causes for discipline, including but not limited to verbal and written reprimand, removal from class, probation, short-term and long-term suspension or expulsion of a student. Other misconduct not listed may also result in discipline if good cause exist (Education Code Section 76034). Whenever it has been determined that good cause exists for student discipline, the District shall notify the student in writing. The student must attend a disciplinary hearing to ensure due process rights. The code of conduct that details the standards is administered by the Director of Student Affairs. Also see BP 5030 titled Fees and BP 5130 titled Financial Aid which addresses consequences of disciplinary action. The complete Student Code of Conduct is available in the Office of Student Affairs, room SU-201, or on the Palomar College Student Affairs web page under policies.

Standards Of Student Conduct BP5500

The following student conduct shall constitute good cause for discipline (academic, administrative or both) including but not limited to the removal, suspension or expulsion of a student, and applies to all students.

1. Cheating, plagiarism (including plagiarism in a student publication), or engaging in other academic dishonesty as defined by the Faculty Senate. Academic sanctions are the sole responsibility of the faculty member involved, further disciplinary sanctions are the preveue of the Office of Student Affairs.
2. Causing, attempting to cause, or threatening to cause physical injury to another person including but not limited to sexual assault or physical abuse as listed in AP 3540 Sexual Assaults on Campus.
3. Possession, sale or otherwise furnishing any firearm, knife, explosive or other dangerous object, including but not limited to any facsimile firearm, knife or explosive, unless, in the case of possession of any object of this type, the student has obtained written permission to possess the item from a District employee, which is concurred in by the Police Chief.
4. Unlawful possession, use, sale, offer to sell, or furnishing, or being under the influence of, any controlled substance listed in California Health and Safety Code Sections 11053 et seq., an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind; or unlawful possession of, or offering, arranging or negotiating the sale of any drug paraphernalia, as defined in California Health and Safety Code Section 11014.5.
5. Committing or attempting to commit robbery, burglary or extortion.
6. Causing or attempting to cause damage to District property or to private property on campus including but not limited to arson and vandalism.
7. Stealing or attempting to steal District property or private property on campus, or knowingly receiving stolen District property or private property on campus.
8. Willful or persistent smoking or vaping in any area where these have been prohibited by law or by regulation of the college or the District.
9. Committing sexual harassment as defined by law or by District policies and procedures.

10. Engaging in harassing or discriminatory behavior based on disability, gender, gender identity, gender expression, nationality, race or ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, or any other status protected by law.
11. Engaging in intimidating conduct or bullying on District-owned or controlled property, or at District sponsored or supervised functions through words or actions, including direct physical contact; verbal assaults, such as teasing or name-calling; social isolation or manipulation; and cyber-bullying.

13. Disruptive behavior, willful disobedience, habitual profanity or vulgarity, or the open and persistent defiance of the authority of, or persistent abuse of, college personnel.
14. Dishonesty; forgery; alteration or misuse of District documents, records or identification; or knowingly furnishing false information to the District.
15. Failure to comply with directions of staff members of the District who are acting within the scope of their employment.
16. Engaging in physical or verbal disruption of administrative procedures, public service functions, authorized curricular, co-curricular, and extra-curricular activities or preventing authorized guests from carrying out the purpose for which they are on District property.
17. Unauthorized entry upon or use of District facilities.
18. Lewd, indecent or obscene conduct or expression on District-owned or controlled property, or at District sponsored or supervised functions.
19. Engaging in expression which is obscene, libelous or slanderous, or which so incites students as to create a clear and present danger of the commission of unlawful acts on District premises, or the violation of lawful District regulations, or the substantial disruption of the orderly operation of the District.
20. Persistent, serious misconduct where other means of correction have failed to bring about proper conduct.
21. Unauthorized preparation, giving, selling, transfer, distribution, or publication, for any commercial purpose, of any contemporaneous recording of an academic presentation in a classroom or equivalent site of instruction, including but not limited to handwritten or typewritten class notes, except as permitted by any District policy or administrative procedure.
22. Violations of District policies and regulations, including, but not limited to, regulations and policies related to smoking/vaping on campus, parking or driving on campus, district computers, telecommunications, campus vehicles, and any and all other District equipment and policies and regulations related to student organizations and student and visitor symbolic expression.

Consequences For Violations Of The Student Code Of Conduct

This section provides information regarding the possible consequences for violations of the Palomar College Student Code of Conduct including incidents of academic dishonesty.

Disciplinary actions may include:

- A. WARNING
- B. REPRIMAND
- C. REMOVAL BY THE INSTRUCTOR: Suspension from class for good cause, by a District instructor - for the day of the incident and for the following class meeting. Instructor's decision is final, and may not be appealed. Instructors must notify the Office of the Director of Student Affairs when this sanction is utilized so that accurate records can be maintained and repeat offenders will be identified. (Ca. Ed. Code Sec. 76032).
- D. COMMUNITY SERVICE
- E. SUSPENSION
- F. EXPULSION

The Board shall consider any recommendation from the Superintendent/President for expulsion. The Board shall consider an expulsion recommendation in closed session unless the student requests that the matter be considered in a public meeting. Final action by the Board on the expulsion shall be taken at a public meeting.

- G. APPEALS

Hearings/Holds

Students failing to meet with the chief administrative officer or designee for a due process hearing will have an administrative disciplinary hold placed on their record until such hearing is conducted.

Student Grievance Policy BP5530

POLICY: Students may initiate grievance procedures when they believe they have been subject to unjust action or the denial of rights as stipulated in published District policies/procedures, state laws, or federal laws. Such action may be instituted by a student against another student, a staff member, a faculty member, or an administrator. When a student believes an injustice has been done, the student may seek redress as outlined in the Student Grievance Procedures. Any questions or concerns related to this policy should be directed to the Director of Student Affairs, Room SU-201. Phone: 760-744-1150 ext. 2594.

Grade disputes are not a part of the Student Grievance. Please see Student Grade Disputes.

Student Rights and Grievances AP5530

PROCEDURE: Before initiating formal grievance procedures, you should first attempt to resolve your concern informally by meeting with the specific individual involved, that is, the other student, the professor, staff member, or administrator. If you believe the situation is such that meeting with the individual would be inappropriate, or you already met with the other

person and failed to resolve the issue, you may proceed to the second step which is to meet with the next level supervisor. If dispute is not satisfactorily resolved through the informal resolution process, the student may submit a formal grievance to the Director of Student Affairs. Appointments with the Director of Student Affairs may be scheduled in the Office of Student Affairs or by calling 760-744-1150, ext. 2595.

Student Grade Disputes

According to Title V, §55025, the determination of the student's grade by the instructor shall be final in the absence of mistake, fraud, bad faith, or incompetency. Students who wish to dispute a final course grade under the criteria listed above must follow the Student Grade Dispute Policy and Procedures, which can be found on the Office of Instruction Web site. All grade disputes must be initiated within one semester of the grade in question being issued.

Academic Freedom

The instructional program at Palomar College shall be conducted in accordance with principles of academic freedom of inquiry. The educational program must encourage freedom of expression and freedom of inquiry within the framework of responsibility.

Palomar College considers academic freedom, defined by its attendant rights and responsibilities, as a vital, primary force in the achievement of the aims and objectives of the institution. Academic freedom involves inherently the following rights and responsibilities:

- To research to the limit of competence and training, the assigned teaching area and its references
- To survey, probe, and question the relationship of humans to their environment within the guidelines of research techniques and intelligent discussion
- To question and challenge, without fear of censorship or discipline, those actions originating from within the institution which seriously affect the total academic environment
- To introduce, within the assigned teaching area, controversial concepts, issues, and systems, subjecting these ideas to the test of objective reasoning
- To create an unhampered and clear intellectual atmosphere democratically maintained, encouraged, and supported by students, staff, administration, and members of the Governing Board
- To associate with those individuals or groups of one's choice without fear of censorship or discipline, unless such association is forbidden by law

At no time will the inherent right of staff to use any of the normal channels of campus communication be abridged, nor will individual staff members be singled out for special prior censorship of their use of such channels of communication. It is understood that staff members exercising this right will accept responsibility for both the substance and the manner of their messages.

The college or university teacher is a citizen, a member of a learned profession, and an officer of an educational institution.

When he/she speaks or writes as a citizen, he/she should be free from institutional censorship or discipline, but his/her special position in the community imposes special obligations. As a person of learning and an educational officer, he/she should remember that the public may judge his/her profession and institution by his/her utterances. Therefore, he/she should at all times be accurate, show respect for the opinions of others, and make every effort to indicate that he/she is not an institutional spokesperson.

Palomar College encourages freedom of expression and the free flow and exchange of information and ideas. The College seeks to protect academic freedom and supports free and unfettered scholarly inquiry. In compliance with these requirements, the College encourages faculty, staff, and student involvement with others in support of candidates for offices or in the furtherance of other political activities.

Also see BP/AP 7370 titled Use of District Resources for Political Activity and BP 2716 titled Political Activity.

AP3430 Prohibition of Harassment

The District is committed to providing an academic and work environment free of unlawful harassment. This procedure defines sexual harassment and other forms of harassment on campus, and in conjunction with associated administrative procedure AP 3435 titled Discrimination and Harassment Investigations and Training, sets forth a procedure for the investigation and resolution of complaints of harassment by or against any staff or faculty member or student within the District.

This procedure and the related policy protects students and employees in connection with all academic, educational, extracurricular, athletic, and other programs of the District, whether those programs take place in the District's facilities, a District bus, or at a class or training program sponsored by the District at another location.

Academic Freedom

This policy works with BP 4030 titled Academic Freedom and is not intended to inhibit or interfere with freedom of expression and freedom of inquiry within the framework of responsibility. It is understood that all employees exercising their rights under Academic Freedom will accept responsibility for both the substance and the manner of their expression.

Definitions

- General Harassment – Harassment based on race, religious creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical disability, mental disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, gender, gender identity, gender expression, sex, age, or sexual orientation of any person, or the perception that a person has one or more of these characteristics is illegal and violates District policy. Gender-based harassment does not necessarily involve conduct that is sexual. Any hostile or offensive conduct based on gender can constitute prohibited harassment.

- Sexual Harassment – In addition to the above, sexual harassment consists of unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other conduct of a sexual nature when:

- submission to the conduct is made a term or condition of an individual's employment, academic status, or progress
- submission to, or rejection of, the conduct by the individual is used as a basis of employment or academic decisions affecting the individual
- the conduct has the purpose or effect of having a negative impact upon the individual's work or academic performance, or of creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work or educational environment
- submission to, or rejection of, the conduct by the individual is used as the basis for any decision affecting the individual regarding benefits and services, honors, programs, or activities available at or through the community college

This definition encompasses two kinds of sexual harassment:

- "Quid pro quo" sexual harassment occurs when a person in a position of authority makes educational or employment benefits conditional upon an individual's willingness to engage in or tolerate unwanted sexual conduct
- "Hostile environment" sexual harassment occurs when unwelcome conduct based on a person's gender is sufficiently severe or pervasive so as to alter the conditions of an individual's learning or work environment, unreasonably interfere with an individual's academic or work performance, or create an intimidating, hostile, or abusive learning or work environment. The victim must subjectively perceive the environment as hostile, and the harassment must be such that a reasonable person of the same gender would perceive the environment as hostile. A single or isolated incident of sexual harassment may be sufficient to create a hostile environment if it is severe, i.e. a sexual assault.
- Sexually harassing conduct can occur between people of the same or different genders. The standard for determining whether conduct constitutes sexual harassment is whether a reasonable person of the same gender as the victim would perceive the conduct as harassment based on sex.

Consensual Relationships

Romantic or sexual relationships between supervisors and employees, or between administrators, faculty or staff members and students are discouraged. There is an inherent imbalance of power and potential for exploitation in such relationships. A conflict of interest may arise if the administrator, faculty, or staff member must evaluate the student's or employee's work or make decisions affecting the employee or student. The relationship may create an appearance of impropriety and lead to charges of favoritism by other students or employees. A consensual sexual relationship may change, with the result that sexual conduct that was once welcome becomes unwelcome and harassing. In the event that such relationships do occur, the District has the authority to transfer any involved employee to eliminate or attenuate the supervisory authority of one over the other, or of an instructor over a student. Such action by the District is a proactive and preventive measure to avoid possible charges of harassment and does not constitute discipline against any affected employee.

Also see BP 3410 titled Nondiscrimination, BP 3420 titled Equal Employment Opportunity, BP 3430 titled Prohibition of Harassment, AP 3435 titled Discrimination and Harassment Investigations and Training, BP 4030 Academic Freedom, and relevant provisions of applicable collective bargaining agreements/employee handbooks.

Refund Policy

Receipts required. No refunds will be made after February 5, 2018.

At the San Marcos campus refunds will be given from the southeast entrance of the bookstore, which faces the M building, during the store hours. Loose-leaf books and those containing access codes may not be returned if shrink wrap is removed.

Check Acceptance Policy

You may purchase items with an imprinted check and proper identification (PIC card and a current driver's license, etc). Any returned check is subject to one or more of the following: a \$25 service fee, a hold on your student record, all fees related to small claims court and up to triple the amount of the check, and any judgments filed on your permanent credit record. A 14-day check clearing period is needed before a refund or exchange will be granted. Approval from bookstore is needed before the end of the refund date.

Credit Card Acceptance Policy

Visa, Mastercard, Discover and American Express credit cards, accompanied with a picture ID, are accepted. A cash register receipt is required for a refund to a credit card account.

The credit card and card holder must be present.

Buyback - Selling Your Used Books

No receipt is required to sell books back; however, a picture ID is required. During finals week you may receive up to 50 percent of the current price on titles requested for the following semester. Textbooks are bought back on a supply-and-demand basis. Titles not requested by a faculty member may be purchased by a wholesaler for 0 - 25 percent of the retail price.

Old editions, out-of-print books, workbooks, practice sets and loose-leaf material have no buyback value.

Rental Books

You must be 18 years of age with a valid government issued ID (driver's license or passport) and a credit card to participate in the book rental program. If you are not of legal age or don't have a credit card, your parent or guardian can register and rent for you either in-store or online at palomarstore.com.

Course Repetition Changes - Due to changes in the regulations that govern California Community Colleges, limits have been placed on the number of times you may enroll in a course.

Keep these changes in mind as you plan your course schedule. If you require assistance, you are encouraged to see a counselor or participate in the array of student support services and tutoring available on campus.

Parking, Traffic Regulations, and Fees

Palomar College Police Department

The Palomar Community College District Police Department is a fully accredited and California POST certified police agency.

The Police Department employs trained police officers whose authority is the same as all sworn peace officers in California. The Police Department will exercise the power to issue official citations for violations of the law, and in situations requiring it, may arrest violators, taking them into custody and booking them into San Diego County jail, located in Vista.

Parking Permits

A parking permit is required for all vehicles on District property 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Online students who come on campus have the option to purchase a semester permit or a one-day permit from the pay-per-day machines in lots 3, 5, 9 or 12. Permit machines at the San Marcos campus and lots 1 and 3 at the Escondido Center accept 1's, 5's and coins, as well as ATM and credit cards.

Student parking permits for spring session may be purchased online between October 30, 2017 and January 21, 2018 with a credit card via the eServices link at www.palomar.edu. Once payment has been received and mailing address confirmed, the permit will be mailed to the student. Online purchase of permits will continue after January 22, 2018, however, those permits must be picked up at the Police Department, located at the main entrance of Parking Lot 1, the Cashier's Office at San Marcos or the Enrollment Counter at the Escondido Center. Parking permits also are available for purchase during Cashier's Office hours at the Cashier's Office on the San Marcos campus and at the Escondido Center from October 30, 2017 through April 27, 2018.

There is no grace period for parking without a permit.

Student permits are valid only in student lots. Parking permit fees are subject to change without further notice.

*Only one discounted permit allowed per semester. In order to be eligible for the lower fee, BOGW students must have acquired BOGW status at the time the permit is purchased. If a regular permit is purchased and the student becomes BOGW eligible at a later date, there will be no refund issued.

Lost/Stolen Permits

The College will not replace lost or stolen permits. The loss must be reported to the Palomar College Police Department (PCPD) and a temporary two-week permit will be issued. If permit is not found within the two-week period a new permit must be purchased at the regular fee.

One-Day Parking Permits

One-day permits may be purchased for \$5 (fee is subject to change without further notice) from machines located in lots 3, 5, 9, 12. Permit machines at the San Marcos campus and lots 1 and 3 at the Escondido Center accept 1's, 5's and coins, as well as ATM and credit cards. Permits will be honored in student lots only.

Visitors may utilize the metered parking spaces located in parking Lot 1. Official guests and vendors of the College may obtain parking permits from the Police Department. These permits are valid in designated spaces/lots only and along the roadway where parking is authorized. One temporary pass will be issued per student, per semester, if the student owns a semester parking permit which he or she has forgotten.

Skateboards

Riding of skateboards and all other roller devices is prohibited on campus at all times. San Marcos Vehicle Code SMMC 12.24.020 (b) 21113, (f)C.V.C.

Miscellaneous Parking Information

- One vehicle is permitted per parking space in lots that are surfaced and striped for parking purposes - All vehicles are required to park in marked parking spaces only.
- A Palomar College parking permit shall accompany a disabled placard. A vehicle displaying a valid disabled placard and a Palomar College parking permit can be parked in any legal parking spot (student or faculty/staff lot.)
- The speed limit on campus is 15 mph.
- Parking in areas marked in green shall be limited to 20 minutes.
- Yellow loading zones are limited to the loading and off-loading of passengers and equipment only.
- Visitor spaces are available for general use, and require payment at the meters which accept coins, credit and debit cards. Four hour maximum time limit.
- Registration/transcript, DMV registration, and license renewal holds will be placed for delinquent unpaid parking citations.
- All California Vehicle Code violations are applicable and enforced on campus.
- No guarantee is made or implied as to parking availability.
- The college assumes no responsibility for fire, theft or damage to any vehicle or contents. Abandoned cars left on campus over 72 hours will be subject to towing at the registered owner's expense.

- Parking lot 12 undergoes resurfacing during spring 2018.

Persons coming on campus for student-related business such as enrollment, financial aid, counseling, etc. will be given a one-day student permit and directed to a student parking lot.

Citations

All citations for parking and moving violations of the California Vehicle Code (C.V.C.) carry the same penalty as those issued by any metropolitan police agency. C.V.C. violations and parking permit violations are enforced 24 hours a day/7 days a week. All violations will be enforced. Paying the fine (bail) within 21 calendar days at the Cashier's office will satisfy citations issued by PCPD. The fine is also accepted by check or money order via U.S. mail; the citation number and date must accompany the bail deposit. Credit card payment may also be made at:

pticket.com/palomar.com. Unpaid citations become delinquent and a late fee equal to the amount of the fine will be due. Palomar College Police Officers are not authorized to dismiss citations. A formal Appeals Process is in place. If you wish to appeal a citation, the forms are available on the PCPD website or you can contact PCPD for the proper procedures and forms.

Administrative Dismissal of one violation per semester may be granted for a failure to display a valid parking permit violation. You must show proof of purchase prior to issuance (date and time) of the citation. Administrative Dismissals apply equally to all students, faculty and staff members of the Palomar College District, and it applies to No Permit Displayed violations ONLY. The violator shall request the dismissal in a timely manner, within 21 calendar days of the date of issuance. This request will be reviewed by PCPD and may be granted at that time.
