President Deegan reviewed the upcoming tasks.

F. INFORMATION/DISCUSSION

1. Student Success Task Force Recommendations

Lynda Halttunen provided an update on the revisions by the SSTF to matriculation.

2. Budget Update

Vice President Newmyer stated that nothing specific to Palomar College has been recently received; statewide, the budget looks bleak.

3. SB 1560 Senate Bill (Exhibit F3)

Laura Gropen distributed a tracking matrix of the 2012 California legislative bills. She explained the intent and progress of the following bills:

- SB 1560-Community College Funding: funding based on completion, AB 2171, and SB 1561
 - o Funding based on the number of students enrolled at census versus the last day of class
- AB 2171-Public Postsecondary Education: Community Colleges: expulsion hearing
 - o Allowing an expelled student from one community college into another

- SB 1561-California Community Colleges: student expulsion: dropped courses
 - o Students will be expelled from school if they drop more than three courses in a semester

4. Smoke-Free Star Award

President Deegan stated that the organization, Tobacco-Free Coalition, presented an award to Palomar College. ASG led the drive to be a smoke-free district, so the award will be given to them. Discussion ensued on the problem of some students who continue to smoke on district property. Mark Vernoy reported that revisions to the smoke-free policy will be discussed in SSPC and then forwarded to SPC.

G. REPORTS OF PLANNING COUNCILS

1. Finance and Administrative Services Planning Council

Vice President Newmyer reported that FASPC discussed its staffing plan and agreed to a 10% cut to its discretionary accounts, and a 20% cut if the proposition fails in November.

2. Human Resource Services Planning Council

Vice President Tortarolo reported that HRSPC plans to discuss cuts and service area outcomes at today's meeting. Joe Newmyer will attend to give a budget update.

3. Instructional Planning Council

Berta Cuaron reported that IPC completed prioritizing its staffing position requests and discussed cuts. Members preferred a 10% cut on 1400's and a 20% cut on other accounts. The IPC faculty hiring priority sub-committee met and plans to submit a new faculty hiring priority list for next year.

4. Student Services Planning Council – no report

H. REPORT FROM PC3H COMMITTEE

Teresa Laughlin reported that a discussion group on gender roles and sexuality within the LGBTQ community will be held on Thursday, March 8, from 2:00 p.m. to 3:00 pm., at the LGBTQ Resource Center, ST-72. Everyone is welcome.

I. OTHER

1. President Deegan reported that Chancellor Jack Scott plans to retire September 1, 2012. The Board of Governors will conduct a search for his replacement and make a recommendation to the Governor.
2. President Deegan stated that applications for the summer session will close at the end of April. It may open again at the beginning of the summer session depending on enrollment. This allows current students access to the limited number of classes before those from out of the District. The number of classes for summer and fall will be the same as last year; however, if the tax initiative fails, spring session may be reduced.
3. President Deegan gave an update on the North Center and the lawsuit filed by the San Luis Rey Band of Indians regarding the Horse Creek Ranch Road.

Introduced by Senator AndersonFebruary 24, 2012

An act to add Section 84502 to the Education Code, relating to community college funding.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1560, as introduced, Anderson. Community college funding: full-time equivalent students.

Existing law establishes the California Community Colleges, under the administration of the Board of Governors of the California Community Colleges, as one of the 3 segments of public postsecondary education in this state. Existing law establishes a system of funding community colleges pursuant to which calculations based on the number of full-time equivalent students (FTES) enrolled in classes at the colleges are a major factor.

This bill would require the board of governors to calculate FTES using the average active enrollment in a course as of a specified census date and at course completion.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes.
State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 84502 is added to the Education Code,
- 2 to read:
- 3 84502. The rules and regulations prescribed pursuant to Section
- 4 84500 shall calculate full-time equivalent student enrollment using

- 1 the average active enrollment in a course as of the census date at
- 2 the one-fifth point and at course completion.
