1. Enrollment Update

VP Kahn provided a Spring enrollment update and reviewed what areas have increased enrollment and what areas enrollment was down. He stated classes were added in areas of high enrollment. President Blake stated concurrent and special populations (such as Oasis and older adults) have not enrolled yet which will increase enrollment.

2. Diversity

President Blake reported the Vice Presidents and the Foundation are looking at diversity in their areas. She stated diversity is not just race and ethnicity, but also how the District is diversifying how we offer classes, student services, human resources and leveraging resources. She asked members to describe what they want to see when the District addresses diversity. Some of the suggestions were:

- Leachtag is offering to show their film at Palomar. A partnership could be built and reach out to the community
- · Fallbrook is the first facility built disability friendly
- · Additional diversity training will be offered by Professional Development
- · A need for a location where people can pick up promotional materials
- Create a culture who is sensitive to diverse populations
- · Look to hire candidates who are culturally sensitive
- Members indicated the need to ensure Diversity is embedded in our practices and not to minimize the need for race and ethnicity in faculty, staff and administration





Local Board goals (AB 1809)

Context and History

- Intentional Focus on Completion
 - Student Success Task Force (2011-12)
 - Student Success Act (AB1415)
- Vision for Success (2017)
 - Many students do not complete their studies
 - Many students take a long time, accumulate a lot of units
 - Older and working students often left behind
 - Community colleges are more expensive than we think
 - Persistent equity gaps exists in outcomes

Seven Core Commitments

- 1. Focus on students' goals.
- 2. Design with students' experience in mind.
- 3. Pair high expectations with high support.
- 4. Foster the use of data and evidence.
- 5. Take ownership of goals and performance.
- 6. Thoughtful innovation and action.
- 7. Cross-system partnerships.

<u>Degree/Certificate Completion</u>: Increase by at least 20%

Transfer: Increase by 35% percent the number of CCC students transferring annually to a UC or CSU.

<u>Decrease Average # Units to Degree:</u> Decrease the average number of units from approximately 87 total units to 79 total units.

Employed in Field of Study: Increase the percent of exiting CTE students who report being employed in their field of study, from 60 percent to 69 percent.



<u>Decrease Average # Units to Degree:</u> Decrease the average number of units from approximately 87 total units to 79 total units.

Employed in Field of Study: Increase the percent of exiting CTE students who report being employed in their field of study, from 69 percent to 76 percent.

Equity Gaps: Reduce equity gaps among traditionally underrepresented student groups by 40% within 5 years and fully close achievement gaps within 10 years.

Regional Achievement Gaps: Reduce regional achievement gaps with ultimate goal of fully closing them within 10 years.

Local Goal Alignment

- New Student Centered Funding Formula Legislation (AB1809) established requirement for local goal alignment
- Districts must establish goals that:
 - Are aligned with the systemwide VFS goals,
 - Are numerically measurable, and
 - Specify the time for achievement.

Local Goal Alignment

District must:

- Adopt goals at public board meeting.
- Include an agenda item explaining how the goals align with system-wide goals.
- Provide agenda item and summary of action to the CO.
- Align its comprehensive plan to its local goals.
- Align its budget with the comprehensive plan.
- Goals must be set by May 2019.

Local Goal Alignment

- Template from Chancellor's Office
- 2016-17 baseline will be auto-populated with metrics from Student Success Metrics dashboard.*
- Goals #1 #4 All Students
- Goal #5 on Equity
 - Select disproportionately impacted students from dropdown list
 - Identify goal that shows faster improvement for that student group than all students.
- * Different definitions / Methodology and we are hearing data in-flux

WAIT!!!!

- Student Equity Plan templates released / Equity Plan due June 2019
- Includes college-level goals and goals for student-groups (disproportionate impact).
- Some are "different" than the Vision for Success goals.
- We will need to set college-level goals and equity goals at same time.
