Meeting called to order at 2:35 PM

A. Opening

1. Approval of Minutes of April 2, 2019

B. Action-First Reading

1. VfS/Equity Goals

Director Barton distributed a document, Vision for Success Goals 1-4 and Goal 5 Equity: Goals for Disporportionately Impacted Categories. She reported the VfS goals were not changed. She reviewed the metrics of Goal 5 Equity, pointing out the baseline and stating the goal is to reduce equity 40% by 2022. Everyone agreed to use the listed numbers.

Director Barton distributed a document, SEA (Student, Equity, and Achievement) Metrics, stating the document shows the goals we are required to set. The first page shows institution goals: enrolled in the same community college, retained from Fall to Spring at the same college, completed both transfer-level Math and English within the District in the first year, attained the Vision Goal Completion Definition, and transferred to a four-year institution. The remaining pages are broken down by demographics: race, gender, disability, first generation, veteran, foster youth, and LGBT. Director Barton led a discussion on how the goals were based, and reasoning behind moving forward with 40%.

This item will return for action/second reading at the next meeting.

C. Integrated Planning

1. SP 2022 Framework

Director Barton led a discussion on the umbrella SP 2022 Goals and each objective listed under it: Goal 1: Student Access, Progress, Completion, and Equity; Goal 2: Teaching and Learning, Ensure Learning; Goal 3: Messaging in connection with our Community; Goal 4: Diverse Workforce; Goal 5: Fiscal Stewardship, Facilities, and Institutional Effectiveness. These were pulled from Guided Pathways and our other Plans; no objectives will be replicated in other Plans. The goals will be connected to our VfS goals but we will transition these to whatever the comprehensive plan requirements are. This item will return at the next meeting.

D. Information/Discussion

1. IPC New Program Subcommittee

VP Kahn reported IPC created a new subcommittee, the IPC New Program Subcommittee, which provides a process for new programs. The subcommittee will provide a recommendation to the Curriculum Committee for new program requests.

2. Guided Pathways Update

VP Kahn presented an update on Guided Pathways. He led a discussion on the work done on some of the Guided Pathways projects, CRMs, and technology and access. He stated the Year 2 Themes are: Career, Mapping and meta majors, Scheduling, AB 705, Onboarding, Wrap Around Services, and Ensure Learning. The Year 2 Plan is due in September; it will go to a final review by SPC in August.

G. Other

President Blake reported the Governing Board is exploring going out for a bond. A consultant is assisting with a feasibility study.

President Blake reported the District is working to get formal South Center status. During the process, it was learned the North Center had a conditional status, which had to be made permanent before we could proceed with the South Center. The application and supporting documents have been sent to the Chancellor's office; we are waiting for the approval. We are in the process of getting letters of support from other learning institutions and the community for the South Center.

President Blake reported we are preparing for the ACCJC Midterm Report by reviewing where we are out of compliance and resolving the issues before ACCJC visits.

VP Rivera-Lacey reported a Student Housing Workshop is scheduled for Monday, April 22. The poll results will be reviewed; they will then be discussed at the next Governing Board meeting.

Acting Dean Diaz reported the mural has been completed. The dedication is scheduled for May 14 from 1:00-3:00 pm with a ceremony. The mural's cost was \$23,000.

CCE President Gonzalez reported the Classifed Luncheon and Pinning is scheduled for June 7 from 11:00am-2:00pm.
