




3.00 hours lecture

Transferability: CSU

An introduction to the principles and practices of counseling and interviewing. A systematic development of the basic skills essential for effective counseling. Combines informal lecture, videotapes, and role playing interactions. Practicum experience will be required.

COUN 101 Transfer Success (1.00)

1.00 hours lecture

Transferability: UC/CSU

Grading: Pass/No Pass Only

Provides the necessary strategies for academic success and the research skills essential for developing a comprehensive transfer plan. Topics will include the transfer process, major selection, student support services, evaluating universities, and clarifying educational goals.

The role of race, ethnicity, gender, class, sexual orientation and age in higher education and personal identity is a central theme of the course.

PALOMAR COLLEGE California State University General Education (CSUGE) Requirements Fall 2023 – Summer 2024

The California State University (CSU) General Education-Breadth pattern allows California Community College transfer students to fulfill the lower-division general education requirements of any California State University campus. The pattern includes 39 lower-division semester units with a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA required, which may be certified by California Community Colleges. Partial certification may be granted by Area (A, B, C, D, E, or F). Full certification may be granted if all areas are completed. Courses may only be certified in one area and must be on the list at the time it was completed. The addition of Area F and changes to Area D are effective Fall 2021 and subsequent catalog years (see footnote for details)¹.

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Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) Requirements Fall 2023 - Summer 2024

The IGETC General Education pattern fulfills lower-division general education transfer requirements for transfer to the University of California (UC) or California State University (CSU). Courses may only be used during the time they were approved for IGETC. All courses used for IGETC require a grade of "C" or better. A "C-"grade is not acceptable. A course may be certified in one area only with the exception of Area 6 double counting in 3B. IGETC may not be appropriate for selective majors at the UC. Students who initially enrolled at a UC campus, and attend a community college are not eligible to use IGETC for the same UC campus. See a counselor for details.

UC-7 Course Pattern (part of IGETC)

Complete the following 7-course pattern by the end of the spring term prior to fall enrollment at UC:

- <u>Two</u> transferable courses in English composition from Areas 1A and 1B
- <u>One</u> transferable course in mathematical concepts and quantitative reasoning;
- Four transferable college courses chosen from at least two of the following subject areas:
 - Arts and Humanities
 - Social and Behavioral Sciences
 - Physical and Biological Sciences

For example:

3 chemistry courses and 1 history course 2 sociology courses, 1 physics course, and 1 art history course 1 biology course and 3 literature courses

Advanced Placement (AP) International Baccalaureate (IB)

- May apply towards Associates, transfer GÈ and major requirements for transfer.
- <u>AP Chart</u>
 - Minimum score of 3 required
 - Can be used to meet General Education Requirements
 - Check with individual universities on how exams are used in the major
- <u>IB Chart</u>
 - Credit only for Higher Level (HL) exams
 - Can be used to meet General Education Requirements
 - Check with individual universities on how exams are used in the major Transfer Tip- There may be other methods other than taking college coursework to earn college credit. Always talk with a counselor to confirm using any of these options for transfer.

Education Plan

- A semester-by-semester course of study outlining a strategy for identifying and reaching your educational goals
- May include career planning activities and support tools
- Developed by you and a counselor
- Transfer Comprehensive Ed Plan
- Educational planning is a team effort between you and your counselor

Transfer Tip: Meet with your Transfer Counselor at least once per semester.

Ed Planning for Transfer

• Consider the "load" you are taking on:

- Full-time school = 12 semester units = 3 to 4 classes
- 1 unit = 1 hour of class per week (usually)
- Study time/week = 2-3 hours per unit
- Work outside of school: Ideally < 20 hours/week

Transfer Tip: Maintaining a high/competitive GPA is IMPORTANT!

Ed Planning for Transfer

- Transfer Universities do not consider how long it takes you to complete your Major Preparation or General Education units in the admissions process.
- Education Planning for Transfer is like putting together a puzzle that is different for each student depending on major, transfer goals, and interests.
- Transfer goals are not always a "2-year" plan

Transfer Tip: Complete Major Preparation and a high GPA make you most competitive.

Transfer Guarantee Programs

- Associate Degree for Transfer (AD-T)
- SDSU TAG
- UCSD University Link (ULink)
- HBCU- 39 HBCUs for CCC students with 3.2 GPA or higher
- <u>CSU Transfer Success Pathway</u>- deferred admission to a CSU for students who applied but not eligible out of high school, re-directed to another CSU or could not attend a CSU due to personal or financial reasons. Must sign-up by Sept 30
- <u>UC Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG)</u>
 - UC Davis, UC Irvine, UC Merced, UC Riverside, UC Santa Barbara and UC Santa Cruz
- <u>UC Dual Admission Pilot Program</u>- 3- year pilot for students who applied out of high school but denied due to missing A-G high school requirements to one of the 6 UC that offer TAG. Requires 3.0. UC will send invite to qualified students


