# Possible Scenarios/Options for Co-Location

# • Option A: 3 centers

- Math Learning Center and STEM Center
  - possibly move to the physical space where the STAR Center is right now in the LRC?
- <u>Literacy and Writing Center:</u> consolidate Writing Center, reading tutoring, ESL
  Center
- o STAR Center: for general tutoring + move Business, CSIT, Veterans to STAR
- Note: World Languages Resource Center and the Reading Center have computer labs that they need for their curriculum/classes – so they should be able to stay in their current locations

# • Option B: 2 centers

- STAR Center: cover all general tutoring + have an area for Literacy and Writing Center (ESL, Writing Center, Reading tutoring)
  - Also move Business, CSIT, Veterans to STAR
  - Where would World Languages and Reading labs go?
- Math Center and STEM Center
  - But what location would they go to
- Note: World Languages and the Reading Center have computer labs that they need for their curriculum/classes – so they should be able to stay in their current locations

#### Questions to Consider:

- Palomar's deficit right now is in General Funds, but much of our funding comes from Basic Skills/SEA, so if tutoring is consolidated, that money will not go back into the General Fund.
  - For example, if ESL tutoring is moved into STAR, those funds will go back into Basic Skills, not the General Fund.
  - This is also true for some of the re-assigned time that Faculty Directors have. The 20% of their re-assigned time that comes from Basic Skills can't be used to pay down Palomar's deficit in General Funds.
- Do World Languages and Reading need to co-locate since their labs are not tutoring centers?
  - o Their students are required (as part of their curriculum) to do lab hours.
- Do the Business Lab and the CSIT Lab need to move since their locations (next to their classrooms) may matter?
- Does the Veterans Center need to have tutoring as a part of a requirement? Do they need their own space?
- Can each center retain its own budget?

- How will apportionment work if there are limited General Funds?
  - In order to collect apportionment, these pieces (amongst others) need to be in place:
    - Peer tutors
    - Faculty line-of-sight
    - General Funds
- Should faculty re-assigned time remain the same?
- How would functions be divided amongst different centers?
- What happens to the Basic Skills funding that some centers have?
  - o It has been moved under Student Equity (SEA) funds.
  - O Any savings generated in soft money (Basic Skills, etc.) has to go back to those accounts, not into the General Fund, so there won't be savings in that regard.
