Associate of Arts (AA) degree in German!

Good news for German students! The World Languages Department now offers a degree and certificate program in German.

Certificate in German – Course Requirements

- German 101* (5 units) = Elementary German I
- German 102* (5 units) = Elementary German I
- German 201 (5 units) = Intermediate German I
- German 202 (5 units) = Intermediate German II



*For students who have NOT taken German 101 or 102 at Palomar College, it may be possible to use Credit by Exam to meet these requirements.

AA degree in German – Course Requirements

German will be your Major. In addition to the courses listed above, general education courses are required to reach the number of units needed for an AA degree. German: 20 Units, 60 Units total for the AA degree.

A **Certificate** is intended to prepare you for immediate work opportunities or to add skills to your resume. Only coursework for the **major** is required. This is the shortest program with various unit requirements depending on the discipline.

An **Associate of Arts** provides academic preparation in a career and requires a minimum of 60 units of coursework numbered 50 and higher. The Associate of Arts in German degree is designed to provide required course work for students majoring or minoring in German. In addition, completing the course work will meet the foreign language competency requirements at many colleges and universities. It will also provide instruction for students seeking foreign language skills for personal development. The degree is intended to provide the opportunity for students to gain proficiency in the German language through the integration of linguistic topics in a cultural context to promote communicative competence.
